Let's Be Bear Smart

Black bears are normally quite wary of humans; however, in Alberta this year, there have been 3 human encounters resulting in death. It is extremely dry this summer and berries are not abundant. Bears are therefore searching for alternate food sources.

Please keep garbage and other food sources inside. No bird feeders. No pet food on the deck. Natural Resources have no bear traps available.

Please be cautious if a bear is encountered. They may appear "cute "but are certainly not cuddly.

NRO's have suggested that, if your cabin is a well-travelled bear path, you can spray or otherwise spread PineSol or bleach on this path and it has been found to be a deterrent.

Council, the VB Police and members of the RM staff have received many emails and calls from concerned residents in regard to the abundance of bears in our municipality this summer. Be bear aware and please take the time to review the Manitoba Conservation Bear Smart booklet at https://gov.mb.ca/ fish-wildlife/pubs/fish_wildlife/bear_smart_booklet.pdf for information on safety in bear

country. Our Conservation Officer in Pine Falls reports that the entire region is experiencing bear issues given the extremely dry summer and the lack of natural food sources.

We've mentioned our bear resistant bin plans many times in newsletters sent out via VB Connect, at Council Meetings and in the VB Herald. Here we go again, by May 2022 all residents wanting curbside pick-up must have a bear resistant bin. Bear resistant bins can be ordered and purchased through the municipality for \$215 or residents can go on-line to search for other bear resistant garbage bin models. Contact Councillor Bartmanovich at mbartmanovich@victoriabeach.ca to place your order or to ask for a review of your current bear-resistant garbage set-up. The municipality has a role to play in public areas and we are looking into appropriate bear resistant bins for high traffic areas and a fenced site for garbage and recycling.





With his mind dwelling in the past and his friends begging him to prevent a grave injustice, Gamache stumbles across yet another mystery that forces him back to the present. Past present and future converge in this beautifully written novel forcing Gamache to confront all his demons in order to finally move on.

I highly recommend everyone come and check it out, even if you haven't read the first six books in this series. This was the first Louise Penny book I read and is still my favourite.





RMVB Garbage Pickup Summer Schedule

Door-to-Door pick-up is as follows (June 28 to Sept. 8, 2021):

MONDAY - Albert Beach, all areas south of Arthur Road and west of
Ateah Road, including Ateah Road

TUESDAY - All avenues in Restricted Area north of Arthur Road including Sunset Boulevard




