

Council Corner

As the days are getting noticeably shorter and the temperature more manageable, it is important not to get complacent with Covid-19 protocols. This past long weekend saw 27 new cases in Manitoba with an additional 30 on Thursday. Let's do everything we can to prevent the spread of this virus from reaching our community. If your family makes the decision to wear a mask, everyone in the family unit must follow suit. Masks should be used whenever in a public space, especially indoors. It is also vitally important that the nose of the person wearing the mask is covered as well as the mouth. If your nose is exposed, the mask is not effective.

As a result of the continued threat that Covid-19 poses to the community, Council is continuing to maintain its virtual meetings, and will continue to do so until otherwise posted. This is to protect everyone involved, our admin staff, Council and our residents. This is not to diminish the importance of having meetings in the RM, but at this time Council feels the risk is too great to host a meeting with a live audience. If there is need to have a delegation with council, please notify the office 7 days in advance of the meeting. Arrangements can be made by calling 204-774-4263 or emailing vicbeach@mymts.net.

On the brighter side of life, the bear resistant bins have been shown to be exceptionally effective at preventing the animals from gaining access to the contents of such bins. However, not only are the normal bins far less effective (if at all), but simply leaving the garbage bag on the side of the road does not prevent access to the refuse. Remember, every time the RM is left to clean up litter, the RM's costs go up. Residents can sign up for bear resistant bins by contacting Councillor Bartmanovich at mbartmanovich@victoriabeach.ca.

Residents are also reminded that the RM of Victoria Beach does not have recycling pick up. Recycling must be brought to the Public Works Yard. When there, be sure to separate glass from your recycling or we must sort the bin out. This costs us all through higher taxes.

Residents are asked to order their Civic Street Signs by going to the RM website (rmofvictoriabeach.ca) or searching "RM of Victoria Beach street signs" in your browser. These signs help to ensure that if there is an emergency at your residence, emergency services are able to find you. There have been several instances where this has proven to be extremely problematic causing the responders to look for a cabin for lengthy periods of time.

significant rain fall, and we are once again, for the fourth straight year, in a drought. As climate change continues to bear down on our community, we should recognize the fire risk around us. The exceptional use of the brushing program ensures that we are able to remove much of the fuel around us. However, we can always do more to protect the community and at the same time beautify our homes. Removing coniferous trees (evergreens) and replacing them with deciduous trees (leafy), and planting them at least 10 feet away from your property is one of the most important things we can do as a community. But the best part is that we are able to choose drought hearty trees that are not nearly as effected by these dry conditions. For this reason and others, Council asks that you visit the firesmartcanada.ca and see what you can do to help protect yourself and your community. Let's all do our part to ensure that our community stands for generations to come!

Due to the risk of fire and any other major emergency that can occur in the RM, Council has implemented the Connect Communication System. We ask that you sign up at your earliest convenience and tell your friends about it. If there is a municipal wide emergency, important communication, or evacuation order, Connect will contact you via all the methods you sign up for such as email, text, or direct phone. As the system evolves, we will have the ability to tell you exactly what to do and where to go based on your location in the RM. You can sign up for Connect by calling into the RM office at 204-774-4263 or accessing the form on our website rmofvictoriabeach.ca. You can also search the link directly via your standard browser by searching "RM of Victoria Beach Connect".

Finally, Council would like to thank all the frontline workers who are working hard to protect our community from Covid-19. You are an inspiration to us all, and we cannot thank you enough!

Door-to-Door pick-up is as follows (June 29 to Sept. 9, 2020):

MONDAY - Albert Beach, all areas south of Arthur Road and west of

TRAVERSE BAY LANDFILL: PTH#11 - 3 miles east of PTH#11 & #59 intersection. Summer Hours OPEN DAILY - 9 am to 5 pm. A pass is required, they can be picked up at the gate, public works, or the municipal office.














Library News



INFORMATION FOR COTTAGE OWNERS



Public health officials advise Manitobans to stay home as much as possible to prevent the spread of COVID-19. When people do go out, they should take steps to maintain social distancing.

If you must travel to your cottage or second residence, follow these guidelines:

- Do not travel if you or any of your family members require medical care or have symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing). If you have any symptoms, use the screening tool at: www. sharedhealthmb.ca/covid19/screening-tool/ before you travel to see if you need to be tested.
- If you or anyone with you begins to feel ill or experiences COVID-19 symptoms, return home immediately.
- Do not use local health providers, unless it is an emergency.
- In the event of a medical emergency requiring evacuation, be sure you can contact local authorities. Emergency contact information varies by region. Ensure you collect and take that information with you before you leave home.
- Public officials have advised people not to travel outside Manitoba, with some exceptions. These rules apply only to travel in Manitoba. Authorities in other provinces control restrictions in those provinces.

- Travel with immediate family members who live with you.
- Do not visit others outside of your immediate family.
- Maintain a two-metre distance from all non-family members,
- > Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly.

- Use local restaurant patios and shop at local businesses, but use curbside or pick-up services where available.
- > Avoid tasks that may result in injury
