Tennis Provincial Grant Application Not Funded


As many of you are aware, the Tennis Capital Campaign Committee did apply for a matching grant of up to \$300,000 for the rebuilding of the tennis facility. The provincial government received over 400 applications with the majority in the eastern region of the province.

The feedback from the province was that the application was very strong, and we have been encouraged to reapply next year. Also, there may be additional grant monies available under a new recreational category that we will be exploring.

The campaign will continue, and we will reach our goal of \$550,000. We ask the community to consider this project as part of your annual charitable giving for the next few years. Think of the brick as what you would pay for membership for summer tennis at any club. You'll find that at \$250/year, it is still a bargain. Many people that have bought a brick have raised their pledge to become a \$2000 builder. You have the option of doing this over the next 3 years, by giving \$567 per year. You can pledge now and pay in the next three December's if the timing is better for you.

We do know that the Appeals for 2022 Property Tax Assessments will be held on October 13 in the RM Office in Winnipeg. Contact the RM Office for details on appealing your property assessment.

We encourage you to sign up for our communication service, VB CONNECT so that we can send you up-to-date information and instructions should an emergency arise in our community. Please go to our website and sign up for this important service. If you need assistance filling out the form, please contact the RM Office at 204-774-4263 or toll free in Manitoba only, at 1-800-513-3839. We will continue to film our Council Meetings and upload them to YouTube via our website.

Bears continue to roam our community and residents need to deal with their garbage properly and be bear aware. Conservation in Pine Falls has received many calls from our residents and they are doing the best they can with the resources they have available. They are the ones who are trained and authorized to deal with problem bears. Our Public Works staff and our police are not trained, authorized or equipped to trap, tranquilize or shoot a bear.

A reminder that as of May, 2022, any resident who uses curbside garbage pickup will require a bear-resistant bin or enclosure. We will continue to fill orders over the Fall and Winter for delivery of bins prior to the May 2022 deadline. Contact Councillor Bartmanovich at mbartmanovich@victoriabeach.ca or the RM office for more information.

Do you already have a bin/enclosure that you feel is bear-resistant? Send a photo to Councillor Bartmanovich for evaluation. If it meets our standard, you're good to go! You don't have to buy the RM bin, but it is a cost-effective choice.

Bear encounters can be alarming – do you know what to do if you encounter a bear? The Province has put out a very informative brochure about bears. We encourage you to download and read the Bear Smart brochure located at https://www.gov.mb.ca/.../fish.../bear_smart_booklet.pdf

RMVB Garbage Pickup Summer Schedule

Door-to-Door pick-up is as follows (June 28 to Sept. 8, 2021):

MONDAY - Albert Beach, all areas south of Arthur Road and west of
Ateah Road, including Ateah Road

TUESDAY - All avenues in Restricted Area north of Arthur Road including Sunset Boulevard

WEDNESDAY - Municipal garbage enclosures in all areas. Garbage is to be placed in garbage bags and left in containers (preferably bear-resistant ones). Containers are to be placed close to the road allowance – not in your front yard – by no later than 8:30am. PICK-UP IS FOR HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE ONLY.

TRAVERSE BAY LANDFILL: PTH#11 - 3 miles east of PTH#11 & #59 intersection. Summer Hours OPEN DAILY - 9 am to 5 pm. A pass is required, they can be picked up at the gate, public works, or the municipal office.

During the COVID-19 summer of 2020, the Herald was especially important for delivering information regarding changes in programming.



At the start, Kevin's contribution included photographs for the Victoria Beach Herald, then co-editing with others in the community, then sharing the role with his wife Barb Pritchard, while working a full-time job with a young family. During the week, Barb attends all of the events and continues to provide additional photography for the paper. All images are gathered, edited and sorted for print.

The VB Herald is a staple of the community for it provides the members of the community with weekly updates and information. This role takes commitment, dedication, flexibility, interest, and passion.

Book Review

A few years ago, I submitted a book review to the Herald for a book by local writer Geoff Kirbyson called The Hot Line about the WHA Winnipeg Jets. I'm back again with a review of his current book: Broken Ribs & Popcorn. His current book chronicles the Winnipeg Jets of the 1980's.

I must confess I love the Jets and, therefore, was looking forward to reading this book about an era of hockey I fondly remember. The author did not disappoint me. In fact, it was better than I had hoped.


The book connects the WHA era Jets to their first entrance into the NHL and their initial struggles after having their team dismantled as a condition to enter the league (the complete opposite of the Seattle Kraken or Vegas Golden Knights experience) to their rise to a top contender.

What I enjoyed was not only the shared memories of the 80's Jets, but the back stories of the events. The author's research and interviews with those involved in these events is extensive. I found the stories about the lesser-known Jets the most revealing.

The Broken Ribs in the title of the book refers to the infamous crosscheck by Jamie Macoun on Dale Hawerchuk in the playoffs that broke Hawerchuk's ribs and dashed any hope to knock off the Gretzky led Edmonton Oilers. The author writes about the event, but what I absolutely loved was the stories of Macoun's family connection with Winnipeg and the life of its own that the crosscheck became. *Spoiler-alert Jamie's brother moves to Winnipeg in the insurance business.

There are happy stories, sad stories, triumphant stories and stories of defeat (those damn Oilers). Overall, I highly recommend Broken Ribs & Popcorn by Geoff Kirbyson as a great summer read and look forward to his next book.


