


Eight at the Gate post ride debrief at the Village Green Bakery patio. Over 16 years of group rides, great friendships and lots of stories.

#### In Memory of Kathleen (Kay/Katie) Smith



Kay graduated from Kelvin High School in Winnipeg in 1943 and later from the Winnipeg School of Art; in the course of her lifetime, she earned a Ph.D. in the art of living graciously. In her youth, she was a talented speed swimmer and down-hill skier, and an active member of the Victoria Beach Club and the Winnipeg Ski Club in its early years. She loved to take long walks and bike rides

Katie grew up during the Great Depression, and like many of her contemporaries, that experience instilled a sense of charity, frugality and humour that was evident every day, in everything she did. Long before it became common, she pioneered the idea of the 'working mom', based from her home in Winnipeg as a freelance commercial artist, while raising and caring for her family throughout the 1950's, 60's and 70's. Despite her busy work schedule, she always made time for family, neighbours, and friends, and to volunteer for numerous causes and charities. Kay was an inveterate letter writer throughout her entire life, and she made a point of staying in touch with the people she cared for.





Some years after the death of her first husband (William Stuart Johnston) in 1980, Katie moved to Victoria, B.C. and married long-time friend Cmdr. RNG (Bud) Smith, RCN (Ret.). During their time together until Bud's passing, they traveled the world, landing in many remote and exotic places, and often with Rotary International work to do. Back at home in BC, she was First Mate on Bud's trawler 'Grand Idea' as they sailed the Salish Sea.

As much as Katie loved travelling, adventure, and her life in Victoria, her favourite place on this earth was Victoria Beach, Manitoba, where she grew up, summered, and weekended for nearly 80 years. She renewed old VB friendships and fostered new ones during all that time. (And wrote letters to them when she wasn't there). It was her place of peace and tranquility, her base.

The woman known to many as Mum, Mume, and Grandma will be missed, but we'll celebrate her life as she would wish us to. Sleep well. You've earned your place in heaven.

Twice last year volunteers from the Victoria Beach area helped the Clan Mothers get their land ready for a healing ceremony.

VBers volunteered to help cut up downed trees, haul & stack wood, rake, trim trees & saplings, clean up some buildings on the site, clean up the beach, erect a teepee, and build a sweat lodge.

We are once again looking for helpers to join us!

What is the Clan Mothers Healing Village?

The Clan Mothers Healing Village (CMHV) will provide mid/ long-term support for women/ girls/ 2SLGBTQQIA who have suffered intergenerational trauma, sexual violence, exploitation, and trafficking. This project is Indigenous-led, femaleled and led with the guidance of Elders and Lived Experienced women/2SLGBTQQIA. You can also visit www.clanmothers.ca or contact Kristie Pearson (Board Member) for more information about the project (see below for her email).

Teachings will be led year-round by Grandmother Elders with decades of experience related to intergenerational trauma. The Village is also working closely with the Lived Experienced Leadership Council (see www.experientialvoices.ca for more information).

Where is the land for the Village?

130 acres of waterfront land has been donated by Réseau Compassion Network (formerly the Catholic Health Authority). The land is in Belair, located just off Lakeshore, less than 10 minutes

What stage is this project at?

Demolition of the old structures on the land has been completed and site works and road works are underway. Construction of the cottages and longhouse begins this fall.

The first social enterprise is also underway! The Clan Mothers

Indigenous led, female construction team will be working closely with the contractors to build the Village and will undergo training (and healing) to become certified to work in construction!

Fundraising has begun. We have raised over half of the \$10 million required to complete the Village. Support from allies and donors such as Réseau Compassion Network, Province of Manitoba, Maple Leaf Construction, Pollard Family Foundation, Johnston Family Foundation, Mahon Family Foundation, PayWorks, Gail Asper Family Foundation, The Winnipeg Foundation, United Way of Winnipeg, PCL Construction, Prairie Architects, and many more have helped build the initial base for our campaign.

Why is a Village needed?

Indigenous women have experienced significant trauma, beginning in residential schools, through the sex trade, incarcerations and too often ending in missing/murdered women. Helping these women to heal and become contributing members of society will save society money. Each woman on the streets can cost society between \$1-1.6 million, impacting systems such as health, justice, and child & family services. More importantly, it is a moral imperative to reconciliation.



#### Derby Details – Results of the 2022 VB Kids Fishing Derby

At many VB Club events lots of participants take home ribbons, but at the Fishing Derby... fish don't care, and not everyone gets a bite.

While we've heard fish tales of the derby peaking at around 75 kids, on Sunday, July 24th, the 2022 version welcomed 35 young anglers. However, with the lower wing of the pier under water and waves lapping at the west side, 35 was a pretty full house.

The good news is the fish were biting. We had a fish about 5 minutes after the horn sounded and we had a flurry of activity in the last 15 minutes! At the end of the pier, the battle for most fish was won by Levi Russell. As others seemed to be closing in on Levi's early lead, the TSN turning point was Levi's "double header" - reeling in a bite to find a fish on each of his pickerel rig's two hooks! Not including all the big ones that got away, the 35 kids landed a total catch of 34 fish, including perch, pickerel/sauger, drum and a lone bullhead catfish caught by 4 year-old Nash Gibson. The award for smallest fish was hotly contested - there were lots of perch and a few pickerel in the 7-9" range.

In an unscientific survey, it was confirmed that about 95% of pier fishing is done with pickerel rigs and frozen minnows. However, it was reported that at least one fish was caught using a cast & retrieve lure. There were also rumours that a delicious minnow & worm combo was a successfully used bait!

The bad news is that the fickle fish weren't biting for everyone. Surrounded by people who seemed to be getting bites every few minutes, some families went the full 2 hours without a fish. But that's fishin'. At least the weather cooperated. And nobody fell off the pier. And nobody got snagged by a hooked.

After the closing horn sounded awards were announced and names were drawn for prizes. Kids were also able to take home fishing magazines, colouring pages and word searches, as well as getting "fish & chips" as a parting snack (potato chips or cheddar fish).

#### Victoria Beach: A 100-Year Love Affair

We lost two pioneers of Victoria Beach this past year - Gordon Saunders at the age of 100 and his wife, June, age 98. Gord met June when she was just 17 and they were married in the fall of 1945, after Gord had finished his Naval Service. They raised two sons, David and Bruce, and daughter, Shelley Saunders (Ken Capelle), who now owns a cottage on Sunset Blvd. No story of their 75-year marriage would be complete without acknowledging the significant role of their cottage years at 301 Third Avenue.

Gord's parents, Charles and Ruby Saunders, bought one of the first ten lots in 1919 in the newly created Victoria Beach. Gordon was born two years later, joining brother, Bob, and sister, Betty. With her choice of lots in the basically undeveloped community, Ruby chose the corner of Third and Patricia. This was only a block up the hill from the beach, yet far enough away from the wicked summer storms. It was also a short walk to one of the original water pumps at the well, on Patricia near Fourth Ave. Hauling two pails of water was a daily ritual that original VB'ers remember only too well. Pictured, is young Charles on Patricia between Third and First Avenues in the early 1920's - no cottages in sight.

When Charles built the cottage, his design included a cupola on the roof, a unique feature in its day, to allow the hot summer air to escape. Its windows, complete with screens, could open and close with an ingenious pulley system. This addition kept the cottage cool, despite the blistering hot Manitoba summers. A big wraparound veranda became the hub of daily life. With the addition of Toronto couches on the verandah, the 4-bedroom cottage could comfortably sleep 13 people and was often put to the test.

Gord recalled the controversy and divided opinions about bringing electricity into the beach in the early 1950's. Refrigeration was a constant problem. Blocks of ice, cut out of the lake in the winter and stored in an icehouse, were delivered to each cottage to cool the fridges. Gord joked that once they heard the clink of the ice cubes in their glasses, the argument was over. Until electricity was brought to the cottages, preparing meals on a wood stove was a challenge for the women who were used to electric stoves; however, it was the source of great interest to the children. Being allowed to light the stove was a summer privilege. Rainwater, collected off the roof, provided water for dishes and basic use, and coal oil lamps were the light source. These were simpler times.

For the first thirty-five years at Victoria Beach, cottagers travelled in by train, and women relied on the fresh vegetables and fish, sold door to door. Stewarts or Sutherlands Store, the butcher shop and Einfeld's Bakery supplied the rest of their summer's groceries. Once the highway was built across the causeway, much was changed at Victoria Beach.

Gord was the family resource for stories of Victoria Beach. He could expound on the Harbour Master lighting the lantern every night at the end of the pier, shining a beacon for boats heading to or from Selkirk. And what story of Victoria Beach would be complete without mentioning the daily train whistling its arrival at noon, and the Friday Night Special bringing the dads down for the weekend? Not many today recall, as he did, the RCAF



pontoon planes from the nearby Military Training Centre pulling into the bay by the clubhouse and being parked up on the sports field. In his 100th year, Gord could still hold his listeners captive with his stories.

Gord and June enjoyed getting to know everyone at the beach, both summer and permanent residents. The Ateah boys who drove the cabs were frequent visitors, stopping in for a quick chat and a cold beverage. The couple loved to entertain and had a lifelong interest in people and their stories. June was a real people person, and was often the instigator of these visits, never happier than when she could host friends and family at the cottage. She was an active member of the Victoria Beach Golf Club and a skilled golfer. It was she who introduced their young sons to the game. Like all the cottagers, opening the cottage for the summer was a highly anticipated event. Gord's spring ritual meant greenhouse visits and a return to the gardening he loved. June would eagerly ready the cottage for the summer ahead.

301 Third became known as Pooh Corner to many, after the mysterious arrival of a colourful figure of Piglet on their boulevard. As one by one, the rest of the Winnie the Pooh characters gradually appeared, the Herald kept everyone posted. Cottagers joined in the fun and families began to come by to see the latest arrival. Gord and June were thrilled to watch the children from their verandah nearby. Later that summer, Gord and his family received an invitation to 'Tea' with the Muldrew family on Second Avenue and the mystery was revealed. Their hosts told of their young relative mistaking the Saunders sign at 301, with the sign 'Sanders' in the story of Winnie the Pooh. With that, the game was on. Gord and June were so delighted with the mysterious gift from strangers, and the interest shown by children passing by, that the figures remain to this day.

For the better part of a century, Gord and June experienced countless changes in their cottage and the community. Both knew how special "The Beach" was, and never took it for granted. Victoria Beach was the Saunders' paradise.




There will be doctors from July 1 - August 21, 2022. The VB Summer Medical Clinic is located at 124 Birch Avenue.

#### **Council Corner**

It's hard to believe that we are half way through summer, but here we are once again, in one of the most beautiful places on earth. It's a place that your Council is continuing to work to maintain as best we can. This had led to our deployment of a rapid response team to deal with the buildup of the brush throughout the RM. While our exceptional Public Works staff has been tackling the backlog of brush piles, it was necessary to provide them with as much support as we could. The result was a joint effort that has now resulted in all brush being collected and chipped. However, with a clear trend of extreme weather, brought on by man made climate change, Council recognizes that the chipping program must continue, but change on a fundamental level to ensure we are able to handle the increased loads of brush that are accumulating. We are now working hard to design a new future for the program and will update you as we are able.

Council would also like to thank you (the residents) for your ongoing exceptional work in clearing out the underbrush on each of your properties. Your actions are continuing to have a profound impact on our fire risk by removing dead and dying trees, replacing conifers with deciduous trees, and taking advantage of our municipal wood chip pile to spread 8 feet from your property in order to retain moisture and add nutrients to the soil. Your actions are making a difference in our community, and we will continue to support these efforts as we design the future of the chipping program.

The RM of Victoria Beach Council is also deeply appreciative of now former Councillor Bartmanovich. His work for the community provided much needed insight and perspective on all issues that faced our council, and his presence will be missed. We thank Mike for his hard work and dedication.

We now look to the future, and our newest member of council, Councillor Ian Chadsey. Ian is a seasoned executive with 40 years business experience in accounting, finance, communications and business development. He began his career as an equity analyst with a brokerage firm on Bay Street in Toronto. He then switched to the corporate side and as a Vice President set up financial and media communication programs for Nutrient, Hydro One, Bell MTS and currently works for Delta 9. Ian has earned an MBA from the University of Ottawa and is a CPA accountant. He was recently on the Board of Directors of Manitoba Hydro and the Canadian Institute of Investor Relations. Truly, Ian will be a great asset to Council and the community of Victoria Beach. Each

member of Council looks forward to working with Ian and expresses our congratulations to him joining our team.

Regarding EMO, we are continuing to work diligently with our EMO Coordinator Shelly Napier of Napier Consulting, the province through DFA, and of course our excellent PW team. As a whole, we are addressing flooding, and fire risk regularly, and leaving no stone unturned in try to find ways to protect our dikes and do what needs to be done in order to protect residents.

Also, a further reminder that despite all of Council's objections and attempts to keep our First Responder program, because of changes from the Province of Manitoba by way of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba, our First Responder program has become untenable. These changes effect nearly every rural municipality and residents with objections to these changes are encouraged to contact your local MLA.

AEDs in the Community: Automatic External Defibrillators are portable units that can be used to shock a patient who is in cardiac arrest. They are very user friendly, require no special training (although some training is always helpful in an emergency) and they are in various locations around our municipality. The municipality is responsible for AEDs for the Police, Fire and Summer Doctor Clinic. Currently AEDs are located at:

- 1. VB Clubhouse on Pier Road when open summer season
  - 2. VB Tennis Court kiosk when staffed summer season
- 3. VB Summer Doctor Clinic 124 Birch Avenue, see Herald articles with opening hours, summer season
- 4. East Beaches Social Scene #3 Ateah Road, year-round during events and activities
- 5. Beaches Community Centre PTH59 north of Ateah Road, year-round during events and activities
  - 6. VB Fire Department when dispatched by 911
  - 7. VB Police in the process of sourcing new unit
- 8. Saffies Store Saffie Road open year-round, check for store hours

A reminder for garbage and recycling, as of next year, residents will have to have bear resistant bins to have garbage picked up. Other non-conforming bins will not receive pick up. Therefore, please contact the RM office to purchase your bear resistant bin as soon as possible. There are still a few left from our last order.

#### **Police Corner**

Back again for issue 7 and we shall already be into August when you read this. I hope you still have good light when you are reading this because the days are getting shorter! Ouch. Just when it looked like things were heating up more rain, more wind and higher lake levels. Where's the beach? But I will be thankful when the fishfly (VB Municipal Bird) season is over. It smelt like rotting fish inside and outside our office for days. I know some of you are having a laugh!)

What a great event Summer Winds was! Job well done. From a Police perspective, there were a couple of events that kept us on our toes but aside those and from a few drunkards that only hurt themselves with headaches the next day it was good. We pulled over vehicles leaving doing sobriety checks but the ones we pulled over were sober. Having a DD works.

On July 20th/2022 at the open Police Board meeting there were a couple of concerned VB homeowners that waited until the end of the meeting to ask questions about the use of ORVs in the ditches along the highways. I am getting further clarification but will hopefully have an answer soon. I agree that it appears that ORVs are allowed in provincial highway ditches as long as they are travelling in the same direction as traffic.

If this is the case....to what end? The causeway ditches prevent ORVs from leaving the island because of high water levels. The ORV Municipal bylaw prevents ORVs getting to the highway ditches in most cases, unless you can get there without using a municipal road or land.

So if you get to the ditch where do you go? Up one side of 59 to the causeway where the ditches are full of water and back down the other side of 59... and a couple of kilometers up and down 504. Remember if you do not have a driver's license you cannot cross the highway.

I have had some complaints of dogs being off leash in the municipality or on the beaches between 10:00 hrs.- 20:00 hrs. So, I've been keeping my eyes open.

I have given a warning to a pup for being off her leash on Sunset Blvd. and another to a big old dog being on a leash on causeway beach a half hour before 20:00hrs. I did see three big dogs on Clubhouse beach before 10:00hrs. sticking like glue to their owners and I talked to them about how it is important to keep dogs on a leash, because we have to respect that some people are scared of dogs. This was a tough one, since there wasn't another soul on the beach that morning. These are the only infractions that I have seen, but if I see the same bad dogs again. I'll be issuing dog tags! (tickets).

#### Karaoke at the Klub Rocked VB!




