Council Corner

It's been another hot, sunny, smoky week at VB. While you and your friends and relatives continue to enjoy all that VB has to offer, we thank you for maintaining COVID protocols, getting vaccinated and for looking out for your friends and neighbours as the heat soars. A reminder that our Fire Ban is still in effect, and we continue to ask residents to limit water usage at this time.

The lanes that were cleared by Hydro in the Fall of 2020 and Spring of 2021 are not to be used for public or commercial vehicle use. Our water lines are in these municipal rights-of-way and they are to be used by Hydro, emergency services and our Public Works crew only. We ask that residents do not block the access to these municipal lanes with rocks, trees, sheds, arbours or other items. Thank you for your cooperation.

Council has been discussing the future of the Moonlight Inn and we need your input. This great old building is nearing 100 years of age and it is certainly showing those years. We need to have a serious discussion with residents about what is required to upgrade the building or how the building, which is used for about 9 or 10 weeks a year, should be used moving forward. The municipality owns the building and the land and we lease the operation of the restaurant out and your tax dollars are used to maintain and improve this building. When COVID restrictions have eased, we would like to have an open meeting to discuss the needs, costs and proposals to keep the building safely operational. Stay tuned for meeting details. We recently applied for funding

to support our plan to turn the old log cottage at the Moonlight into community accessible washrooms. We hope to hear back on that grant application in the near future.

Please take the time to review our Zoning By-Law 1622, available on our website. This by-law dovetails with our Development Plan and covers all things construction or demolition related in the various zones in our municipality. A public hearing will be held prior to second reading of the by-law to hear residents' concerns. This hearing will be advertised in the Winnipeg Free Press, via VB Connect and on our website.

We are working with the Province to take ownership of Crown Land in our municipality. It is a long process that will require some time and patience from all parties. Crown lands in our municipality include many of our public shorelines. This would allow Councils of the day to have more control over structures on and alterations to the shorelines, and all the good and bad that that control would bring. It is important to know that there are some shorelines that are privately owned to the waters edge and those property owners' rights should be respected at all times.

Unfortunately, our first public Council meeting may not happen until September, contrary to Council Corner in last week's Herald. We are working to make this happen as soon as possible.

Finally, we will be watching the Province's next COVID-19 announcement in early August pertaining to indoor and outdoor activities. Our hope is to hold a "Coffee with Council" event here at the beach before the end of summer. Stay tuned!

As COVID protocols continue to improve we expect to see more activities at VBCC.



Clan Mothers Healing Village

On Saturday July 24, about 100 volunteers from the Victoria Beach area went to help the Clan Mothers get their land ready for an upcoming healing ceremony. VBers volunteered their muscles and time to help cut up downed trees, haul & stack wood, rake, trim trees & saplings, clean up some buildings on the site, clean up the beach and build a sweat lodge.

The Clan Mothers were overwhelmed with gratitude. VBers - you can work hard! Thank you so much for your muscles & time! Here is a note from the co-founders Elder Mae Louise Campbell & Jamie Goulet:

"We have reflected on the day, and it brings tears of joy to both of us. Finally, we are at Peace with this project. We are reclaiming the land and Mother Earth herself is shining her life energy back to us ...deep sorrow is finally being released. Miigwetch."

What is the Clan Mothers Healing Village?

The Clan Mothers Healing Village (CMHV) will provide mid/long-term support for women/girls/2SLGBTQQIA who have suffered intergenerational trauma, sexual violence, exploitation, and trafficking. This project is Indigenous-led, femaleled and led with the guidance of Elders and Lived Experienced

women/2SLGBTQQIA. You can also visit www.clanmothers. ca or contact Kristie Pearson (Volunteer Chair of the Fundraising Committee) for more information about the project (see below for her email).

Teachings will be led year-round by Matrilineal Elders with decades of experience related to intergenerational trauma. The Village is also working closely with the Lived Experienced Leadership Council (see www.experientialvoices.ca for more information)

Where is the land for the Village?

130 acres of waterfront land has been donated by Réseau Compassion Network (formerly known as the Catholic Health Authority). The land is in Belair, located just off Lakeshore, less than 10 minutes away.

What stage is this project at?

Phase 1 of the Village commenced last year with zoning of the land, planning, and design work with the construction team. Ceremonial structures will be built this summer so healing can immediately begin on the land.

Phase 2 involves building living areas for staff, Elders, and the women. We expect shovels to be in the ground for Phase 2 in summer of 2022. We will involve the women in the construction process as a training opportunity.

Fundraising has begun to raise a portion of the \$10 million required to complete the Village. Support from allies and donors such as Réseau Compassion Network, The Winnipeg Foundation, United Way of Winnipeg, Lush Cosmetics, PCL Construction, Prairie Architects, and more have helped build the initial base for our campaign.

Why is a Village needed?

Indigenous women have experienced significant trauma, beginning in residential schools, through the sex trade, incarcerations and too often ending in missing/murdered women. Helping these women to heal and become contributing members of society will save society money. Each woman on the streets can cost society between \$1-1.6 million, impacting systems such as health, justice, and child & family



services. More importantly, it is a moral imperative to reconciliation.

In Winnipeg approximately 400 children and youth are sexually exploited on the streets each year, 70-80% of which are Indigenous. Street Reach found that 213 youth in 2012 were either currently being exploited (118) or were at extreme risk of becoming exploited (95).

Other statistics about trafficked and exploited women/2SLGBTQQIA include:

- 81% had family in residential schools
- Age 13 was the average age at first exploitation
- 62.7% had been physically and sexually abused

- 74% had been in care of Child and Family Services
- 8% has run away on average, 16.19 times, with the initial runaway at 11.19 (mean)
 - 48.9% had been homeless
 - Grade 7 was the average grade level completed
- 19.3% had been in a gang, 65.1% had family members involved in a gang
 - 56% were associated in some way with a gang
- 83% received drugs or alcohol from their exploiter as a method of control



Back by popular demand, there will be a third Kirbyson Doubles Clinic to be held on August 10. Times and sign up sheets will be posted soon.




only twenty-five members did not seem right. (We had tossed around doing it later in the year, possibly in the city, but the reality is we don't know what lies ahead in 2021 to make any concrete plans.)

Of course this means there can't be the yearly election either, should there be anyone new who wants to run for the executive. So, the four of us – Blake Taylor, Kathy McKibbin, Linda Kliewer, and Andrew Stelmack – have agree to stay on for another year. (If anyone wants to help out on the board as well in the interim, don't hesitate to let us know!)

Over the winter and spring your VBCOA executive were strongly active in letting council know the VRA's positions, on behalf of the membership, on the following: Allowing snowmobiles and ATV's on our restricted roads in the off-season, the proposed selling of RM lots on Gibson that are now used as paths for residents, the alteration of the shoreline on Arthur by a private property owner despite councils disapproval, the newest By-Law proposal that wants to allow for more clearing of the land on our shorelines causing further deterioration of the banks, the passive approach to land being cleared on public shoreline cliffs, the RM's desire to widen our roads, as well as our continued presence regarding deadfall and decaying trees on RM property and the Fire Safety consequences. We made great headway on most issues, and it is because of all the emails you sent to council to back us up! Never underestimate how important it is to stay informed year-round and let your voice be heard to maintain and protect the vehicle restricted area of VB when needed!

To keep yourself up to date, remember we have a private Facebook page for VBCOA members. On top of regular updates on the above issues, it is here that we get to have civil engaging discussion on the issues brought forth by our membership. The private FaceBook page has also been offering tips and information on Fire Safety, our tree canopy, the spring water issues, the doctors office, the census, and the Fire Bans, among others. Our private Facebook page continues to be a focused page on matters solely pertaining to the VRA. We now have over three hundred FaceBook members and recommend you join it if you or your family own a cottage or permanent home in the VRA. To join go to the VBCOA private group page, click on "request to join" and be sure to answer all three questions.

If you are not a FaceBook user you can still keep up to date on any issues that arise throughout the year, by regularly checking out our website www.vbcoa.ca. As well, if you want to be alerted on anything that we deem as a critically important, pressing and/or time sensitive situation for the VRA, please be sure you are on the mailing list. You can join by contacting us at vbcoaexec@gmail.com with your name and VB address.

Going forward into the fall and winter of 2021-22 these are the important issues that we see on the horizon:

- A new By-Law 1622 (clearing vegetation on the banks) is being introduced by Council. We see this as a very real threat to the stabilization of the banks/shoreline and to the aesthetics of our beaches.
- The need for the VBCOA to send a delegation to the government asking that the responsibilities of the public beaches and how they are maintained and protected be turned over to the RM. This could be with the proviso that the Shoreline Erosion Technical Committee always be consulted as well as our own Shoreline Committee. (We requested making a joint presentation with RMVB, but our request was denied by Council).
- With the growing turnover of cottages to newcomers which we welcome, and increased renting of cottages fewer and fewer are being handed down to the next generation. We are proposing a new "Welcome to VB" pamphlet distributed to all new owners, all renters, and all real estate agents selling property in the area so that all are clear what the vehicle restricted area is all about. It is important to convey our history and what we need to do to maintain and respect it.

- A continued push for clearance of deadfall on public property and making sure the roadways stay as they are.
- Forcing expensive "bear resistant" garbage cans on taxpayers, telling them that without them they will not get the garbage pickup service that their tax dollars entitles them to.
- How to improve and make more convenient the garbage and recycling drop off area.
- Council has placed 1.2 Million Dollars in the 5 year plan for the construction of a municipal office

to be built in 2023, when the majority of property owners do not reside in the RM.

- Please remind everyone that an RMVB municipal election is in 2022. It is imperative that all of our traditions are maintained, respected, and appreciated by those who run. We must have an immediate voice(s) on council to remind those who may not fully understand our specific needs.

As well, since we cannot have an AGM this year, the executive is also planning to do a wrap-up video talking about the year and the year looking ahead, sometime before the end of the summer. We will let you know when it is ready.

In closing we wish everyone a wonderful rest of the summer and fall, and we look forward to the day when we beat covid, the pandemic is in the rear view mirror, and we can all get together once again as a group to celebrate the special place that is Victoria Beach!

Thank you to all shoppers and especially the market volunteers who make this possible every Saturday. We have ninety-five (95) vendors registered to participate in the market throughout the summer.




