

In Memory of Bill Mitchell


Long time Victoria Beach summer resident Bill Mitchell, beloved husband and family patriarch, passed away on April 29th of this year.



Lillian and Doug rented their first cottage on Centre Avenue in Victoria Beach in the late 1950s and eventually purchased their small one-bedroom cottage in 1964. Lillian, her father Ted Pickering, a carpenter by trade, and Doug built the first addition consisting of a dining room, 4 bedrooms, and a bathroom in 1965. Over the years Lillian renovated the cottage and finished the interior of the sunroom, utility room, and guest cabin.

Each summer, Mom would pack up the station wagon on the last day of school with the groceries, the Newfoundlander dog, 2 cats, 2 turtles, 2 hamsters, a canary, and 4 children. Summers at Victoria Beach were filled with tennis, golf, swimming lessons, and lots of fun with friends. Supper was always at 5:30 which left just enough time to get to the store with Mom for treats before movie night at the Clubhouse. We only returned to Winnipeg the night before school started, with suntans and a summer filled with Victoria Beach memories.

Lillian's days at the beach were focused on family life. In addition to her immediate family, Lillian was a fabulous host to her parents, her sister June's family from Vancouver, and relatives from England. The family cottage became a very busy place with family and friends during the summer. As the kids grew older, Lillian's days at the beach started with several hours of tennis each morning followed by 9 holes of golf in the afternoon. Each evening, Lillian walked throughout Victoria Beach and always greeted everyone she met with a friendly smile and hello. She played bridge for many years hosting different groups of friends at the cottage, playing at the Clubhouse on bridge night or at the Seniors Scene. Lillian and Doug organized the Annual Victoria Beach Dog Show and were very involved in running the Victoria Beach Tennis Club. In 2008, they were awarded the Vilis Anson Memorial Volunteer of the Year Trophy to recognize their years of service and dedication to the Victoria Beach Tennis Club.

Lillian is greatly missed but her love of Victoria Beach lives on through her family. The family will have a memorial bench installed this summer at Pier Point to commemorate Lillian and Doug Hancock as the wonderful and giving people, parents, and grandparents they were.

Signup sheets for Robert Kennedy's Singles Clinic (Adult) being held on July 18th will be available July 14th at the Kiosk.



Walk for Water 2022: The impact of spring flooding on the health of Lake Winnipeg



This spring saw widespread overland flooding across Manitoba following a high-volume snow melt and a series of intense storms. In addition to the immediate effects on homes and community infrastructure, flooding can have significant downstream effects on Lake Winnipeg.

Excess phosphorus from various sources across the lake's watershed drives the growth of algal blooms. Phosphorus is transported to the lake via water flow, from rivers which receive their waters from smaller creeks and streams, and from overland runoff.

Not only is there more water available to transport phosphorus in flood years, research has also demonstrated that total phosphorus concentration in rivers during flood years is much higher than in non-flood years. This is because in a flood year, water sits on the land (like in the accompanying photo by Paul Mutch), enabling phosphorus contained within the soil beneath it to be released into the overlying water – almost like steeping tea.

The Red River Valley is an extremely flat landscape dominated by high-intensity crop and livestock production, and its soils are rich in phosphorus from fertilizers and animal manure. Floodwaters extend over a very large surface area – and the longer water sits on the land, the more phosphorus is taken up. While some of this phosphorus will eventually settle out of the water into sediment, the rest makes its way to Lake Winnipeg, where it can be used by algae as a food source.

So, does the extensive flooding we've seen this spring mean algal blooms are a sure thing this summer?

Not necessarily.

A scientific study released in 2018 used satellite imagery to view algal blooms over 10 years on Lake Winnipeg. Researchers were able to identify patterns and found there are two factors to consider when predicting the likelihood of severe algal blooms: how much phosphorus comes into the lake in the spring and how warm the lake's surface-water temperatures get in the summer.

In other words, whether or not we experience significant algal blooms this season will depend on Manitoba's summer temperatures.

This research underscores the impact of climate change on phosphorus loading to Lake Winnipeg. Climate change is expected to cause warming temperatures, as well as increasing frequency and severity of storms – both of which will increase the severity of algal blooms.

It also underscores why monitoring for phosphorus is so important. Since 2016, the Lake Winnipeg Foundation has been coordinating the Lake Winnipeg Community-Based Monitoring Network. Data collected by this program allows us to understand

where and when phosphorus is running off the land and into our waterways, enabling targeted action to reduce phosphorus loads – one of the key factors contributing to algal blooms on the lake.

ENHANCING ACCESSIBILITY AT VICTORIA BEACH

Following up on our Accessibility Matters article in the July 1st issue of the VB Herald, we'd like to share some more important accessibility information with residents.

People living with disabilities want to enjoy the full beach experience while at Victoria Beach. The Accessibility for Manitobans Act that was passed by the provincial government in 2013 mandates that most organizations and businesses in the province are responsible for removing barriers that may prevent people from being able to receive information, services and goods, or to access spaces or activities. Council and the Accessibility Committee have been working diligently to identify and remove these barriers. We are proud of our accomplishments and also very proud to have received an Accessibility Award for our progress to date from the Manitoba Accessibility Office in 2020.

Since 2017 a number of initiatives have been implemented to reduce or eliminate barriers in our community, including:

- 1. Mobility scooters are available for rent at the Parking Lot during the summer
- 2. Sheltered space is provided for recharging and storing mobility scooters
- 3. Several Accessible Parking spots have been created at the Parking Lot
- 4. Council has committed to making all new structures and renovations to existing buildings barrier free. That includes, but is not limited to, ramps, lever handles, automatic doors, ac-

cessible washrooms, and other improvements.

- 5. Policies for granting vehicle permits for people with medical conditions and people with specialized, adapted vehicles have been clarified
- 6. Yellow visibility strips have been added to the stairs at the bakery and the store for people with vision impairment
- 7. Ramps have been added (and improved) to the bakery and the store for people using wheelchairs or mobility scooters
- 8. Automatic doors have been added to the bakery and store
- 9. Smaller metal handrails that are easier to grasp have been added to the stairs at the bakery, the store and some beaches
 - 10. The stairs at Clubhouse 2 beach have been upgraded
- 11. Accessible washrooms are available at the Winnipeg Office, the Parking Lot and at Pier Point
- 12. The database of information supplied by residents for the VB CONNECT system will allow for enhanced planning and emergency response for those with special needs.

Work continues to identity other barriers and find reasonable accommodations to allow all residents and visitors, including people with disabilities, to enjoy the full Victoria Beach experience. We will be providing further educational and information articles in the VB Herald during the summer and our next one will provide information on proposed accessibility upgrades and projects to enhance accessibility in our community.

Council Corner

As we move forward through the summer season, we can all be thankful that there are beginning to be more sunny days than there are days of rain. This is helping our Public Works Staff, and the incredible staff at Wayne's Backhoe get a handle on the much-needed repairs on the Wanasing and Albert Beach Dikes. At this time, much of the urgent repairs to the dikes have been completed, and (saving any major storms or major unexpected increases in the lake levels) much of the imminent dangers of severe flooding has eased.

While this may be the case, the RM is still in constant communication with DFA and EMO. Furthermore, we continue to monitor the condition of the dikes in Victoria Beach on a daily basis and are prepared to react quickly should the situation change.

With the immense pressure on public works in these times of emergency, our Public Works staff has been working under incredible pressure to keep up with everything on their list. Council greatly appreciates our staffs hard work in these stressful times and reminds residents that our priority, as well as Public Works', must always start with the protection of life and property. This may mean that some tasks be delayed in their completion dates compared to a normal year; but if something is on the list, we will get to it at the earliest opportunity.

We have started a Disaster Financial Assistance Claim for flooding issues. This is expected to aid us with up to 80% of our emergency repairs. We have also opened an insurance claim for the repairs to many of our beach staircases, due to the May 31st storm.

We have also received several requests for a mosquito control response by way of a fogging program. At this time, Council does not have any plans to re-introduce a fogging program for mosquito control. As a study published in the National Library of Medicine states: "For the invertebrate pollinator, the probability that fogging had a negative effect 24-h post-fogging was also 100%, with reductions to 53% of the pre-fogging count of live individuals" (ncbi.nlm.nih.gov). Therefore, we ask that residents can help to lessen mosquito populations by dumping standing water around your property.

Council would also like to remind residents that while the drought is clearly over, and we are still seeing quite a bit of rain, our fire risk is still very much a reality. This risk is greatly exacerbated by the density of coniferous trees which "burn anywhere from

five to 10 times faster than [deciduous] trees" (agric.gov.ab.ca). This is due to the flammable resin held within the bark of the tree. To lessen our risk of an out of control wildfire, it is important to remove and replace coniferous trees with deciduous. You may also help to retain soil moisture and increase soil stability by laying down wood chips at least 8 feet from your residence.

We appreciate the attendance of many residents at our second Public Hearing for the Zoning By-Law #1622 on Tuesday, July 5 at 1:30 pm. What we heard loud and clear was your displeasure on our communication of this Hearing. We did follow the advertising and notification procedures in the Planning Act however it appears that was not enough, which we apologize for.

It became apparent that not everyone has signed up for, or is aware of, VB CONNECT, our municipal emergency communication system. Please go to our website at www.rmofvictoriabeach.ca and scroll down to the bottom of the home page to see Victoria Beach Connect and click on the "Register Now" button. Use your Victoria Beach address. If you need help, please contact the RM Office directly at 204-774-4263 or via email at vicbeach@mymts. net.

Property and water utility bills are due for payment no later than July 31, which is a Sunday. A reminder that the office is not open on weekends so please plan accordingly.

Brush pick-up has been completed by our chipping contractor. Public Works will be picking up the rest of the brush in the RM and Albert Beach was the first to be picked up. Please do not add more to the piles and ensure any private contractor you hire takes your debris to the Traverse Bay Landfill.
