



Tips for Clearing Deadfall

Cleaning up your yard this summer? Remember to keep an eye out for deadfall! If you have dead trees on your property - whether standing dead trees ("snags") or coarse woody debris - consider removing them in a strategic fashion to reduce your property's risk of wildfire. According to FireSmart Canada's FireSmart Begins at Home Manual, the accumulation of fuels can generate heat and embers. Included within their recommendations is the removal of woody debris and combustibles from around your property. If you're going about doing so, here's some things to consider:

- We are just nearing the end of the nesting season for many of the birds in our ecodistrict. Always be sure to check any trees or shrubs for nests or animal activity before removing them.
- Cleaning is best done in the spring or fall when you are allowed to put brush on the piles around the RM. If you remove brush during the summer, be sure to contact one of our local tree companies to have the brush chipped and removed. Refrain from stacking brush on your property to wait until the fall – this posses a fire risk.
- Know your limits with a chainsaw. Safe chainsaw operation includes wearing proper personal protective equipment and having sufficient training to operate the chainsaw within your limits. Serious injuries can result from inexperience and chainsaw operation. If in doubt, call an arborist.
- If you're considering pruning trees on your property to remove deadwood, remember that trees seal over their wounds not heal. As a result, any pruning cut made on a tree stays with it for life. Many homeowners will accidently prune a branch too close or too far from the tree. If you feel unsure about where to properly prune a tree and wish to call an arborist, remember to ask if they are a licensed or Certified Arborist™. In Manitoba, an arborist must be licensed or Certified to prune trees. You can find an arborist at
- You may consider retaining snags or coarse woody debris on your property to the benefit of wildlife. If doing so, be selective in the retainment of certain species as some will pose a higher risk than others. Be sure to consult with a forester or arborist if you are unsure which trees to retain as wildlife snags.

Life on the Wild Side (An Open Letter to the RM of Victoria Beach)

What a privilege it is to still have places like mention the resultant reduction in wildlife habitat. Victoria Beach, where we city folks can escape to the wild side — experience the sights and smells and sounds of the forest! What a shame it is to encounter forces at work that counteract the joy and the beauty of that experience. Building development is bad enough. Worse are practices and rules that replace common sense and communal sensibility in an effort to maintain the very milieu that we come here

The most recent official affront is the poorly thought out set of recommendations regarding 'FireSmart' practices for cottage owners placed in this year's welcome packet. On our small lots in the Vehicle Restricted Area, maintaining a 10-metre buffer between trees and the cottages coupled with pruning branches two or three metres from the ground, would effectively destroy the natural ambiance as well as any semblance of privacy, not to

Without retaining the forest, we might just as well remain in the 'urbs'.

Of course, there is a risk of fire, just as there is the ever-present risk of falling trees — yet we have come here to be in the forest! The administration can do much to assist residents with good site management practices to reduce these risks to acceptable levels. Rules to restrict brush pick-up to two months of the year, and tree-removal recommendations replete with mathematical miscalculations and plant list errors stop short of being helpful. Careful thought and wise resource management providing direct owner assistance with both hazardous tree removal and the timely disposition of brush will surely do all that is required for safe life on the wild side.

We have managed to keep the virus out of our community so far and we thank each of you for doing your part to ensure the health and safety of our community and our families. Our municipal offices are still closed to the public per COVID protocols. Please respect the health and safety of our front line workers who include our administrative staff in Winnipeg, our Public Works team, our fire fighters and first responders, our police officers, our Summer Information Office staff, the Golf Course employees and our Building Inspector. We have had a few power outages recently and we are very pleased that our new generators at the 8th Avenue Water Treatment Plant and at the Albert Beach Water Plant have kept the municipal water systems working without interruption. The outdoor tap on the Albert Beach water plant has been turned off for the summer season and potable water is available at the VB Fire Hall. We encourage residents to limit water use and use water conservation devices and low flow appliances whenever possible.

The VB Accessibility Committee provides valuable input and feedback on the Provincial accessibility standards and ways that our municipality can improve and implement those services and policies. You'll notice a new automatic door and updated ramps at the VB Bakery. Hand rails are being added to various sets of municipal stairs.

We hope to have more benches for residents to rest on in various locations while being mindful of the outrageous cost of lumber these days. Thanks to Public Works for building 2 wheelchair accessible picnic tables and installing one at the Moonlight Inn and one in the Village Green. Thanks to Graham Todd at Reliable Mobility for the delivery of our 4 mobility scooter rentals, available through the Summer Information Office for \$20 per day.

We need to be able to reach our residents in the case of an emergency. Please take the time to sign up for VB CONNECT on our website. You can choose to receive information via your land line, cell phone, text or email. 



"Birthplace of the Air Force in Manitoba" RCAF and Yacht Club Commemorate 1921 Opening of Victoria Beach Air Station

To commemorate the centennial of the Victoria Beach Air Station, which opened July 1, 1921, 17 Wing Winnipeg of the Royal Canadian Air Force is presenting the Victoria Beach Yacht Club with an RCAF ensign. The Yacht Club will fly the ensign from its flagstaff throughout the 2021 sailing season.

The RCAF ensign will be hoisted for the first time in an unveiling ceremony at the sailing compound on Yacht Club Beach at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 3. Present will be VBYC Commodore Brad Scott with executive members and the Commander of 17 Wing Winnipeg, Colonel J.G.D. (Dave) Proteau, a 34-year veteran of the RCAF, who spends summers with his family at Victoria Beach. While members of the Yacht Club and public may attend, please adhere to public health orders and guidelines.

The Victoria Beach Air Station, which operated from 1921 to 1926, was a government "air harbour" established on the land and adjacent shoreline now occupied by the Victoria Beach community's sports field and Yacht Club. Immediately north-east of the sports field is an interpretive panel, erected in 2019 to mark the centennial of the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach, with archival photographs of the Air Station during its later years. The Air Station's canvas hangars once stood on the present-day baseball diamond.

This government Air Station was established in the spring and early summer of 1921 by the Flying Operations branch of the Air Board of Canada and was the first in Manitoba and one of the first six in Canada. Others were at: Dartmouth (Halifax), Nova Scotia; Roberval, on Lac St Jean, Quebec; Rockcliffe (Ottawa), Ontario; High

River, Alberta; and Jericho Beach (Vancouver), B.C.

The aircraft operated from these Air Board Air Stations (except for High River) were "flying boats": fixed-wing airplanes with a strengthened fuselage, a rugged, wooden boat-like hull, specifically designed to float directly on water, and to withstand the pounding and high stresses experienced when taking off and landing. These were heavy, rugged aircraft, stabilized on the water by a pair of under-wing floats near the wing tips. Unlike land planes of that era, or modern float planes, they lacked any landing gear with wheels or skis, which restricted their operation to seasons when Canadian waters are ice-free. From May to October, flying-boats were well-suited to fly into lake-filled wilderness areas of northern Manitoba and Saskatchewan and northwest Ontario at a time when no airfields or roads had yet been built anywhere on the land below.

In January 1921, the Air Board decided to establish an Air Station, initially as a base for aerial patrols to detect and suppress forest fires in northern Manitoba. Major B.D. (Basil) Hobbs, DSO, DSC, of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, was appointed the Air Station Superintendent, at age 26. During the First World War, after initial flight training in 1915 at the Orville Wright School of Aviation in Ohio, he joined the Royal Navy Air Service in Britain. He, like many other pilots who flew from Victoria Beach, was a naval military pilot: what is today called a "top gun". Hobbs was decorated for his service as a pilot of flying boats on antizeppelin and anti-submarine missions over the North Sea. He remained in command of Victoria Beach for four years through 1924, holding the RCAF rank of Squadron Leader. Today, the headquarters building of RCAF 17 Wing Winnipeg is named in his honour.

In April 1921, the site selected by Major Hobbs was leased from the Victoria Beach Company (which originally intended the land for a resort hotel, never built). In May, an advance crew of civilian airmen arrived to construct the first buildings and receive delivery, at the adjacent Victoria Beach railway station, of equipment, supplies, and vehicles, including the first aircraft. At the Dartmouth Air Station, two single-engined, ex-U.S. Navy, Curtiss HS-2L flying boats were disassembled, loaded into crates and onto flat cars, then shipped by Canadian National Railways to Victoria Beach. In July, a contract was awarded for construction of a timber platform which used as its foundation concrete footings already on site for the hotel. By summer's end, the platform supported a timber-and-canvas Bessonneau hangar. Tents and rented cottages housed the station's 24 employees.



One hundred years ago this week, the Air Station began operations with its first test flight. A crew of airmen using ropes and a team of horses hauled the first reassembled HS-2L aircraft, which weighed three tonnes, from the grassy field and dragged it across the sandy shoreline. When launched into the waves of the bay, the machine floated on the surface. Once hauled into deeper water, the bow and wing tips were secured by lines to a mooring buoy anchored in the bay, within view from the Victoria Beach government pier.

On Friday, July 1, 1921, a canoe with a small outboard motor mounted on the transom set out from the shoreline from a small dock on Pier Road, near where swimming lessons are now taught. The canoe carried the air crew to the aircraft: a pilot and an air engineer wearing flying suits and helmets made of leather, and fitted with goggles. After climbing aboard and into the open cockpit, the pilot engaged the throttle and magneto ignition, the engineer manually cranked the 12-cylinder Liberty engine and 4-bladed propeller, both mounted behind the cockpit, and the engine roared to life. The craft taxied across the bay, pointed into the wind, then the pilot shifted the throttle control to wide open. The machine roared and built up speed as it hit the waves. At 50 miles per hour (80 km per hour), the hull lifted over the crests of the waves into the air. The aircraft climbed slowly. The machine made a brief and successful test flight over the treetops of the Victoria Beach peninsula, then circled south and settled down again on the waters off Bayview.

The next weekend, on Sunday, July 10, Major Hobbs flew a giant, twin-engined Felixstowe F-3 flying boat from the Red River in Winnipeg, near the Norwood Bridge, to Victoria Beach. He made brief stopovers on the Red near Selkirk and on Lake Winnipeg between Grand Beach and Victoria Beach. This F-3, constructed in England and powered by two Rolls Royce Eagle VIII V-12 engines, had already made history in October 1920. It had flown the longest leg of the first-ever trans-Canada flight, from Rivière-du-Loup, Quebec to Winnipeg, piloted by the Air Board's Flying Operations Director Lieutenant Colonel Robert Leckie and Major Hobbs (as Sheila Grover described in the Winter 2021 issue of Prairie History). The F-3 was stored over the winter on the banks of the Red, near Brandon Avenue in the Riverview district of Winnipeg, where in later years all flying boats from Victoria Beach were hauled from and into the water each autumn and spring.

The RCAF Historian, Wing Commander F.H. Hitchen,

has written that the new Air Station at Victoria Beach "within a few years became one of the most important centers of civil government flying in Canada". During 1921, four flying boats operated from Victoria Beach: two HS-2Ls and two F-3s. In 1922, two more F-3s were added, the largest number of this type of aircraft to operate from any single location in Canada. The following season, 1923, brought a twin-engined Curtiss H-16 and the first of a new purpose-built type, the Vickers Viking flying boat powered by a single Rolls Royce engine. In 1924, six of the total eight Vikings in the RCAF fleet, and several smaller Avro Viper seaplanes, were assembled at Victoria Beach, and operated from Victoria Beach and its sub-bases in Northern Manitoba at Norway House and Cormorant Lake. By this point, Squadron Leader Hobbs commanded 5 pilots, one photographic officer, one equipment officer, and a staff of 47 airmen.

The original mission of Victoria Beach was to perform forest ranging patrols and assist in fire suppression on Crown lands, then the responsibility of the Forestry branch of the federal Department of the Interior. After an F-3 made an 1,100-mile demonstration flight to Norway House, The Pas, and Cumberland House, Saskatchewan in 1921 and another in 1922, the mandate soon broadened to provide other services for many branches and federal Departments. In 1922, a pioneering wireless telephony system linked the Forestry branch officers in Winnipeg, Victoria Beach, and Norway House, and an experimental aerial survey was conducted to test innovative methods for creating accurate topographic maps from mosaics of oblique photographs.

This work culminated in 1924 in a pathbreaking 2,800-mile expedition to conduct the first major aerial photographic survey ever conducted in Canada, in the uncharted Reindeer Lake and Churchill River region of northern Manitoba and Saskatchewan. This historic mission was completed over a month in a Vickers Viking flown from Victoria Beach by Squadron Leader Hobbs, with Dominion Land Surveyor Robert G. Davidson as navigator, RCAF Photographic Officer D.J.R. (Jimmy) Cairns, and RCAF air engineer Corporal A.J. (Alex) Milne. Cairns, facing 60 mile per hour winds at an altitude of 5,000 feet while manually operating a large-aperture Fairchild camera from the open front cockpit, took over 1,700 photographs covering over 15,000 square miles. Cairns' photographic output included many outstanding images of the Victoria Beach Air Station throughout its existence.

Victoria Beach may legitimately claim to be the birthplace of the Air Force in Manitoba. In 1922, a winter base was established in Winnipeg, with headquarters at Fort Osborne Barracks. A continued next page






maintenance facility was set up in rented premises above a Ford dealership on Maryland Avenue to perform the service and overhaul of engines and airframes outside the flying season. From May to October, the main operational base reverted back to Victoria Beach. On January 1, 1923, when the Department of National Defence succeeded the Air Board, Victoria Beach became the first operational base in Manitoba of the Canadian Air Force and subsequently a Royal Canadian Air Force base when the RCAF was officially formed on April 1, 1924. Victoria Beach remained an RCAF base until 1926, when operations and many structures were relocated to a new base established at Lac du Bonnet, Manitoba.


