#### Music And Festival Fever Grips The East Beaches In July

120 Volunteers make Summer Winds Family Music Festival happen

The Juno award winning band, *PRISM* is headlining the 15th anniversary of the Summer Winds Family Music Festival which comes to Victoria Beach Sports Centre in the East Beaches on July 21 and 22 of 2023. *PRISM* will play on Saturday night right after the warm-up bands of *SHE*, *DUST RHINOS*, *and ATOMIC CANDY*. The Friday line-up includes, *WITCH HAZEL*, *STONEWALLED*, *SEAN TAYLOR BAND*, *and INCREDIBLY HIP* (a Tragically Hip tribute group). Check out the Summer Winds website Summer Winds Family Music Festival (summerwindsmusic.com) for times and details.

Expect to be well entertained, not only with and well-rounded selection of music makers, but also the warm fuzzy feeling that comes from the festival fever that dominates the weekend as folks spread out their blankets and lawn chairs on the grounds of the Victoria Beach Sports Centre. Look for food, face painting and games especially for the kids, plus family and friends who descend upon the Beaches at the end of July that mark this event as a summer highlight. Food, liquid delights, facepainting, keepsakes – it is all in Victoria Beach and all in the name of community.

"It is a well-oiled machine" says Glen Halgren who along with his wife Cathy hatched the idea of a family music festival over fifteen years ago. From the beginning the couple have skillfully executed the final product. Tom Aldridge, who takes

over as manager in 2024 for a four-year term, agrees that it is an exceptional group of volunteers. He says, "I am inheriting a wonderful group of committee members who make the job easy." Not that Aldridge is new to the game. He has been working on the committee nearly since its inception and looks forward to "bigger and better". Likewise, the same sentiment is shared by Terri Keith who, since 2018, has been booking the bands for the event. She says, "I got "roped-in by my dear friend Tannis Hughes who passed away just over a year ago. Tannis and I had been besties since we were kids and when I retired back in Manitoba, I was happy for the opportunity to give back to the community where I spent all my summers. It is a terrific group of people who are fun to work with."

The fact is that the Sports Centre has been bought-and-paidfor thanks to the volunteer efforts of the creators of the Summer Winds Family Music Festival. What began with \$12,000 revenue has mushroomed to as much as \$80,000 as the festival has evolved. Private sponsors are largely responsible as the catalyst for the huge overhead involved in producing a show of this caliber. Each year organizers fill the music roster with professional musicians whose talents are known not just in Manitoba but worldwide. For the show, volunteers make it look easy. You can find them wearing their complementary orange T-shirts. Some work just two hours, others work countless hours arranging security, vendors, activity coordinators, food and beverage handlers, bandstand set-up, outdoor biffies, grounds maintenance, parking attendants, to say nothing of stagehands, electrical and technical equipment, and outlets plus community outreach with both the administrators of Victoria Beach and other not-for-profit stakeholders in the area. Regardless, every volunteer earns a shirt. They will be there on July 21 and 22nd on the baseball field along the highway in Victoria Beach.

## **Council Corner - Emergency Preparedness Edition**

This past Wednesday, July 12, we had a tabletop exercise of our Emergency Response Plan. It is important for all of us to be to be diligent and know what to do when an emergency breaks out in our community.

You can find an expanded and more detailed explanation of the following on the Victoria Beach Website under "Municipal Emergency Plan". In an emergency, listen to the messaging from Council by way of our emergency communication system <u>Connect</u>, messaging on our website, our official municipal Facebook page, and follow all orders from police, community safety officers, Fire department, and local officials.

**Connect:** It is vital that residents sign up for the RMVB *Connect* system so that you know what you should be doing in an emergency to keep yourself safe. Ensure you sign up using your Victoria Beach address.

**Don't Panic:** Be prepared by reviewing the following and the *Emergency Response Plan* on the municipal website. If you hear a verbal command by a local official, ensure you understand their message. If you receive a digital message through Connect, our Facebook page, or website, read the directions given to you <u>fully</u> so that you understand them. When you understand the directions given to you, act in a swift and focused manner.

**Emergency Response Plan:** Review the Family Emergency Response Plan on the RMVB website. It is also highly recommended that you review the full *Emergency Response Plan* located on the same page.

VRA Parking Lot: If you find yourself in the VRA during a wildfire, do not rush to your vehicle unless directed to do so by local authorities. Follow the directives given to you. You should also know the fastest route to the water from your home, and have a secondary beach chosen as a back up.

**Vulnerable residents:** If you would need physical assistance during an evacuation contact the RMVB office at 204-774-4263. You will also want to have a primary person to help you evacuate and 2 backups in case emergency personnel cannot reach you.

Have an evacuation plan: In an emergency, Council will be responsible for making the decision for an evacuation and inform residents to do so through *Connect*, our official Facebook page, and our website. However, if emergency personnel give you orders to evacuate or relocate, do so immediately by following their exact instructions.

Have a "go bag": An emergency "go bag": should include everything you need for at <u>least 72 hours</u>. Necessary items include but are not limited to: copies of personal documentation, (if possible) a two-week supply of medication and medical supplies, Freeze-Dried Food, dried pet food (if you have pets). flashlight with backup batteries, candles, matches, a first aid kit, a mini fire extinguisher, emergency water filter, extra keys to your vehicle, an air horn or whistle, mini radio, manual can-opener.

Minimum additions for permanent residents in winter include: multiple thermal blankets and a box of heat pads.

**Shelter-in-place:** This is a risk reduction strategy that may be

employed in circumstances where remaining in buildings and homes can be an effective barrier to a hazard. During a shelter in place: 1) Do not leave the building until you are told to do so. 2) Close all interior and external doors. 3) Close all windows. 4) Do not use bathroom vents or kitchen vents. 5) Turn off the power to your home. 6) Do not use fireplaces and close all dampers. 7) Shelter in an inside room away from windows and doors. 8) Follow all messaging from local officials. 9) Only use your phone and devices to follow local updates unless you are in imminent danger.

In an emergency, don't call us, we'll call you: Once given an order to evacuate or shelter-in-place, only use your phone or devices to follow updates or to contact emergency services if you are in imminent danger. Council and emergency services need their lines to remain open to resolve an emergency as quickly as possible. Furthermore, non-emergency usage unnecessarily increases data and cell traffic which can congest networks. Staying off your devices will allow for municipal messages and updates to be delivered quicker and those who require emergency assistance to receive life saving aid faster.

**Family Muster Point:** Ensure you have a family muster point and run several drills a year so that you can take a headcount of your family members in the event you have to evacuate or shelter in place. Think of it in the same way as a school fire drill.

**Fire Extinguishers:** It is very important that you have the largest manageable fire extinguisher you can on hand and easily accessible in your residence.

**Fire Pit Permits:** Permits must be completed and approved before use of any fire pit. Go to our website under Forms & Documents or pick up a hard copy at the mailbox on the west side of the Firehall. If a Fire Ban is in effect no outdoor fires are permitted.

Another Drought Year and Ongoing Fire Risk: Our forest is currently a boreal old growth forest, meaning that it has been overgrown with highly flammable coniferous trees (evergreens). The role of coniferous trees in nature is to pave the way (through wildfire) for a revitalization of the forest and birth a new growth deciduous forest.

To reduce our risk of an out of control wildfire, residents are reminded to review the FireSmart initiative and enact all that is reasonable for your property. 1) Regenerate your forest by beautifying your property and remove and replace coniferous trees (evergreens) with <u>drought-resistant deciduous species</u>. 2) Remove all material from under your residence. 3) Ensure you maintain a five-metre gap between your cabin and the surrounding trees where possible. 4) Utilize wood chips and weighty mulch around your trees to reduce moisture evaporation. (Don't set mulch directly against the trunks as doing so can damage them) 5) Clean your eavestroughs. 6) Add non-combustible three millimetre screens to external vents. 7) Move firewood at least ten metres away from your home. Residents can find more information at firesmartcanada.ca.



# Advocacy and Action for Lake Winnipeg

A Lake Winnipeg Foundation Education Evening

What is the relationship between collecting small samples throughout Manitoba, walking in the Walk for Water and signing advocacy cards?

To reduce phosphorus loading to Lake Winnipeg, we need to know how, when and from where phosphorus is entering the lake. The Lake Winnipeg Community-Based Monitoring Network

(LWCBMN) is a long-term phosphorus monitoring program that mobilizes volunteer citizen scientists and watershed district partners across Manitoba to collect water samples in order to identify "phosphorus hotspots" – localized areas that contribute higher amounts of phosphorus to waterways than other areas.

Because citizen scientists live, work or commute near their sampling sites, they can sample frequently in response to weather events and water conditions. Collected water samples are analyzed in a lab, and this data is then combined with water flow data, enabling LWF to calculate the amount of phosphorus being exported off the landscape and into the waterways that flow into Lake Winnipeg.


LWCBMN has been nationally recognized for its ability to successfully engage citizens in cost-effective, scientifically robust water stewardship, and for its role in addressing Canada's chronic data gap by supplementing and enriching existing federal and provincial datasets.


Since its establishment in 2016, LWCBMN has been generating the data needed to inform policy, direct research and focus action where it will have the greatest impact.

Targeting phosphorus-reduction initiatives within phosphorus hotspots will reduce the amount of phosphorus entering Manitoba's lakes and rivers, and improve the health of Lake Winnipeg by addressing the root cause of harmful algal blooms.



## 100 Years of Golf at Victoria Beach

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the official establishment of the Victoria Beach Golf Course. The interest in having golf available locally however, had its start a few years prior, when a few of the pioneer cottagers took matters into their own hands. According to a long-time cottager, work on the first course (located on what had been James Paulson's homestead and the site of the Beach's original day-school), began in 1919, with a work bee gathering on Saturday afternoons to clear enough of Paulson's former acreage for two holes of golf; the men cleared brush, while the ladies made tea and moved the cut wood into piles.



Work on the golf course progressed rapidly when Frank Sprague was hired as the General Manager of the Victoria Beach Company. Along with his oversight of the development of the new resort, he was himself an avid golfer. In a 1961 interview, Sprague's daughter described her father as having toured many golf courses before finalizing plans for Victoria Beach's course, including a provision for an additional nine holes should the need arise. The new course was opened in 1923.

The course was the beneficiary of significant investment by the



Victoria Beach Company, with improvements under way soon after it opened. By 1926, many of the fairways had been widened and several holes had been moved. Readers of the Victoria Beach News (1926-1929) and the Herald which followed were kept abreast of achievements on the course, with several golfers being lauded for their holes in one...on the second hole. Given that the second hole is a par 5 (502 yards) on the current course, this would indeed be newsworthy. However, in the early years, the second hole was actually today's (much shorter) par 3 third hole on the golf course. Other holes were lengthened over time and reconfigured altogether.

The Victoria Beach News reported on improvements to the course for the 1929 season; perhaps most notably, the 9th hole was moved 50 yards to the east of where the former tennis courts had previously been as it was deemed too close to the golf clubhouse. The Beach's first tennis courts were located at the golf course until they moved (in 1927) to the former air station grounds.

An early groundskeeper was Steve Bouthilier, who Sprague sent to Montreal in 1928 to gather ideas that might enhance the local course. Other improvements would follow: a resident instructor was hired in 1931 to help new golfers improve their skills; a golf clubhouse of log cabin construction, outfitted with grass-woven furniture and originally intended to be the residence of the course superintendent, had been built in 1927, with a refreshment stand conveniently located nearby. In 1927, the News reported that that liquid refreshments were being served at the Clubhouse, with "a dainty French-Canadian lady being in charge."

Golf proved to be a successful venture: in 1925, 2,000 rounds

had been played that season; by 1929, 17,000 rounds had been played at an average cost of 13 cents a round. While the Herald suggested that another course might be an option in 1930 (or an extension of the present course), this was never acted upon.

Affordability has always been a characteristic of the local golf course. In 1929, nine holes could be played for 50c a round, or \$1.00 for all-day play on weekends or holidays. Strip tickets could be purchased in the early 1930s, reducing the per-round cost to 22 cents.

Children were encouraged to take up the game early on, with below-cost pricing offered. Tuesday and Thursday afternoons were set aside in 1931 for young people at a rate of 5 cents per round. Parents were reminded a few years later to provide the young ones with proper golf clubs, "as no amateur-made contrivance will be allowed on the course in place of a club." As late as 1956, children (14 years and under) could golf on Tuesday afternoons for 10c per round. The long-standing tradition of children's golf came under threat early in 1961 when it was announced that revenue of (only) \$67.00 from the previous season's children's golf days would see this long-standing tradition cancelled, albeit briefly before it was reinstated. One hundred years on, children's golf remains an important fixture of the Beach's golf season.

Being the competitive lot that they are, golfers could take advantage of many tournaments. One early match (in 1930) pitted single members against married members of the Victoria Beach Club in a 18-hole tournament. In the years that followed, the McKinney, Fred Porter and Jimmy Grant trophies brought out the best male golfers at the Beach, while the Pratt Memorial Trophy for Juniors was awarded to the top boy or girl golfer. The first Women's Tournament wasn't organized until 1953. Casual golfers had their chance at fame as well: a popular attraction at Victoria Beach's course for many years was the 'hidden hole', where one of the nine holes would be identified (and known only to golf course staff), with prizes awarded for both low and high scores, and names published in the Victoria Beach Herald for all

Everyone was encouraged to enjoy the course, whether they golfed or not. Non-golfing acquaintances were welcome to walk the course after 8:00 p.m., the Herald announced in 1940 and a few years later suggested tongue-in-cheek that "non-golfers (should) just sit around and observe how golf should and should not be played".

Good advice was often offered (but often, likely ignored) by the local newspaper to golfers. In 1936, golfers were encouraged to "Get all the good out of a game of golf without spoiling the exercise through temperamental (sic) explosions." In 1941, 'Hints for Average or Less Golfers' included the admonition to "Please think of the next shot as a new ray of hope."

One hundred years have now passed since the first golf ball has hit off the first tee at Victoria Beach. The porcupine who visited the clubhouse for a week in July 1941 and was fed bread with sugar is now long gone, although the descendants of the family of red deer who roamed the greens in June of 1926 are likely not far away. The horse-drawn mowers of the 1950s have been (thankfully) retired, but the Victoria Beach Golf Course remains a cherished part of this lakeside resort. Here's to the next 100

#### **VB Police Update**

Summer Winds Family Music Festival starts today and all of our Police officers and Community Safety Officers will be working. Please Drink Responsibly and remember the smoking of Marihuana is not allowed in a public place. Any questions regarding safety, please call.

Off Road Vehicle (ORV) use is restricted to the ditches of our Provincial Highways #59 and #504. DItches does not mean two wheels on the shoulder. This unfortunately limits use in Victoria Beach until after the Thanksgiving Long Weekend when the municipality opens up the AB2VB trail and ORV users are allowed to egress and ingress from their cottages or homes. For more information, please refer to BY-LAW 1643.

I would like to educate and/or remind motorists of the Highway Traffic Act Law which requires them to SLOW DOWN when passing roadside emergency vehicles when their lights are flashing. This includes Police, Community Safety Officers, Tow Trucks, Ambulance & Fire. In Victoria Beach the speed limit is 70 km/hr or lower and there are not any multi-lane roadways so the law is that when passing an emergency vehicle with lights activated you MUST slow down to 40 km/hr. Due to oncoming traffic and other safety concerns it is not always possible to move over so SLOW DOWN and you're good. Move over, if possible, but SLOW DOWN.

On the topic of Slowing Down and Moving Over remember to do the same for cyclists. They have a right to be on the highway, when riding single file and as close to the shoulder as possible.
