

## Use Your Voice to Protect Lake Winnipeg

Citizens have great power to influence change – especially when we work together!

Since 2005, Lake Winnipeg Foundation members have championed the need for evidence-based solutions to reduce phosphorus loading to the lake. Together we have called for action on multiple critical issues impacting Lake Winnipeg. Here are three opportunities for you to stand up for the lake this summer.

## Opportunity 1: Renewed federal funding for the Lake Winnipeg Basin Program

From 2008 to 2022, the federal Lake Winnipeg Basin Program provided dedicated, multi-year support to address the eutrophi-

cation of Lake Winnipeg by investing in phosphorus-reduction projects and providing opportunities to ensure meaningful inclusion of Indigenous peoples in water governance.

During last fall's federal election campaign, the Liberal Party of Canada promised \$1 billion over 10 years for a new Freshwater Action Plan. Instead, Budget 2022 committed only \$19.6 million for just one year. With ongoing federal support now uncertain, we are at risk of losing the progress achieved over 15 years of collaborative effort funded by the Lake Winnipeg Basin Program.

How you can help: Join us in calling on Canada's government to keep its promise and renew federal funding for Lake Winnipeg as part of Budget 2023. LWF has created a postcard that can be filled in and mailed – no postage required – to the federal minister of Environment and Climate Change, the Honourable Steven Guilbeault. You can find this postcard in the Spring & Summer paper edition of our newsletter, The Watershed Observer. Extra postcards will be available at the Victoria Beach and District Walk for Water. ## Opportunity 2: Phosphorus compliance at Winnipeg's north end sewage treatment plant

Winnipeg's North End Water Pollution Control Centre (NEW-PCC) remains the largest single point source of phosphorus to Lake Winnipeg. Public pressure is having an impact – but our job is not done until phosphorus compliance is actually achieved at the plant!

Winnipeg City Council will vote in July on a revised plan for interim phosphorus removal at NEWPCC. This plan improves on a recommendation first made by LWF and our partners, with a more effective design that will maximize phosphorus removal and reduce the amount of sludge produced as a by-product. If approved, the revised interim solution is anticipated to be operational by August 2023.

LWF strongly supports this plan. However, the interim solution alone will not be enough to meet the 1 mg/L phosphorus limit of NEWPCC's operating licence.

To achieve phosphorus compliance as soon as possible, the city must integrate interim phosphorus removal into the upcoming design and construction of the Phase 2 Biosolids Facilities Project, which is part of a larger, full-plant upgrade.

In June, Winnipeg's public service released a report which recommended a new enhanced preliminary design for the biosolids project. Included in the revised scope is additional biosolids digestor capacity.

Again, LWF strongly supports this plan. By building additional digester capacity as part of the Phase 2 project rather than waiting till 2037 as originally planned, the city will achieve phosphorus compliance much sooner and at much reduced cost, reduce wetweather sewage spills like those we saw almost weekly this past spring, enable continued city growth, and save money in the long run.

How you can help: Help ensure Winnipeg's political leaders and public service follow through on their commitments. In the leadup to October's civic election, engage with candidates. Tell them you expect the interim phosphorus removal project to be completed by August 2023. Ask them to commit to approving the enhanced design for the Phase 2 Biosolids Facilities Project as part of an evidence-based approach to accelerated phosphorus compliance at NEWPCC. Remind them that continued delays are unacceptable.

#### Opportunity 3: #AlgaeWatch

Elected officials monitor what their constituents are talking about on social media, while trending topics often get picked up by local media, which helps further amplify citizens' concerns.

If you experience algae on the lake this summer, snap a photo and share it on Instagram, Twitter or Facebook using the hashtag #AlgaeWatch. The more attention an issue receives, the more likely politicians and journalists will take notice! Hello everyone – we hope that your summer is going along 'swimmingly'. Reports of dragonflies finally arriving has certainly taken a bit out of the mosquito population!

While our EMO and Public Works folks concentrate on flooding, here is an update on other things happening in our community -

Garbage and Recycling: Residents are reminded that the current garbage and recycling area at the Public Works yard is not a landfill site. You or your contractor are responsible for taking your old stoves, toilets, mattresses, barbeques, bike frames, paint and oil cans, lawn chairs, bed frames and building materials to the Traverse Bay landfill. It is a few kilometers east of Traverse Bay Corner, on Highway 11. Pick up a free Landfill pass from the Public Works office and take your items to the landfill. The garbage bins are for bagged, household garbage only. The new Garbage & Recycling site is still under construction, o please stay tuned for updates.

**Bear-Resistant Residential Garbage Bins:** The latest order of 250 bear-resistant residential bins have arrived. If you ordered one, once it is put together it will be delivered to you. If you want one, please contact the RM office at 204-774-4263 or 1-800-513-3839 to place your order. A reminder that residents wishing to have road-side pick-up will need to have a bear-resistant bin by May of 2023.

**Zoning By-Law #1622:** A second public hearing was held on July 5 to hear presentations on the Zoning By-Law. Thank you to all residents who attended for your comments. Please stay tuned for future updates on next steps.





# **Beach People - Hampton Family Gathering 2022**

"On the northeast point lived the first family to ever settle here." Laela Ateah-Lester wrote in her family history, "Cedars of Lebanon, 1951." Henry aka Rattlesnake Hank, Hampton and his brother James arrived at Little Elk Island as Victoria Beach was then known in 1882. Although from Courtland, ON, they arrived here from south of the border. As two single men in their early 20s, they settled on the northeast corner of section 14 as it was titled after the 1885 survey of this territory. The part of the homestead where the house was now belongs to Brian and Darlene Bowden.

On Saturday, July 2, over 140 descendants of Hank and wife Annie got together to celebrate the family being here for 140 years. Many who attended were 3rd and 4th generations who were born and raised at VB, some who remain, and their kids and grandkids.

Hank married Annie McLennan in 1888 at the home of her grandparents, James & Isabella Bird from St Andrews. They soon had 9 children including Fanny b 1889, married Jim Olafson, Icelander and fisherman; Lizzy b 1890, married Nick Joseph who started Saffies store and whom had recommended VB to his fellow Lebanese immigrants, the Ateahs; Annie b 1891, married English immigrant Bert Martin, a carpenter who built St Michaels Church; Jimmy b 1893, married Mary Jane Sinclair, longtime housekeeper of the Vincent family; George b 1895, who died in infancy after stumbling into a vat being boiled to scald catfish; Harry b 1897, married Ruby Rupert, daughter of Capt John Rupert; Willie b 1899, married city girl Kay Lemon; Charlie b 1901, married Millie Rupert, sister of Ruby; and lastly, Flossie who died as a child. In her book, Laela considered the sons "the best fishermen in these parts." Both Jimmy and Harry left VB to fight in WW1.

Lester-Ateah also wrote concerning Hank, "a more colorful or romantic character you would never meet anywhere." Hank like his father-in-law Murdoch McLennan was an adventurer. Murdoch left his family twice to go on Arctic expeditions, firstly with Dr John Rae then Sir James Anderson, to find out what had happened to Sir John Franklin. Hank was there around a campfire when Mr Charles Volks, one of the earliest campers along with the Kennedys, met a young girl named Victoria Fontaine that gave him the idea to honour the British royal family by using their names. Hank was also on the first RMVB council.

The family gathering earlier this month was meant to connect generational descendants with each other, with the family history and of course, with Victoria Beach. All three goals were accomplished. Shirley Lekei nee Joseph was the only one of five surviving 3rd gens to attend. We hosted the event on the property of Earl, 4th gen grandson, & Pat Olafson on 504. We started the day with a cemetery tour sharing how we were all related, reminiscing about these ancestors and reflecting on how hard life must have been for this family growing up in the wilderness before others came to settle and camp. Some enjoyed a tour to the Founding Families monument at the Village Green and a hike to the old homestead. What everyone enjoyed most was the perfect weather and just sitting around and visiting.


Beach People continued

We also want to thank Byron Unger for the marquee tent as well Kevin and Larry Ateah for lending us other equipment. It might be of interest that when the Ateah patriarch Michael passed away in 1937, the six pallbearers were Hank and Annie's sons and two sons-in-law. Good to still be working together generations later.

Final words by Doris Stucky nee Olafson: "To the Hampton reunion, I hope you were glad you came. I wish you all a safe journey on your way home. May God bless and keep you throughout the year. I loved remembering then making new memories."







GO. Doors and canteen open at 6:00 PM and games start at 700 PM.





## Weekly VB Recipe Ideas

Do you have the morning struggle with what to make for dinner tonight while at the beach...Do you want some healthy options that don't require you to be in the kitchen all day (I want to stay at the beach as long as possible!) I'll provide some weekly ideas this summer based on things I've made that have been a hit at our cottage with ingredients that can mostly be found at our local store.

#### **Chicken Burgers**

450 grams (1 lb) ground chicken

- 1 green onion chopped fine
- 2 Tbsp parsley chopped fine
- 1 Tbsp Dijon mustard
- 1 Tsp ground sea salt
- 1 egg

Mix all ingredients and form into patties Makes approx. 6 small burgers Pan fry or BBQ

Serve with - Green salad and a roasted vegetable such as asparagus, broccoli or steamed green beans. Top with lettuce tomato and the condiments of your choice (I like Dijon and mayo)

- \* Tip #1 I actually love to eat these without a bun on top of my salad. Makes it lighter and cuts out unhealthy carbs.
- \* Tip #2 These can sometimes be hard to put on the BBQ If prepped in advance put them in the freezer for an hour to harden them and make them easier to put on the grill


