It has been another hot, dry week in our province and in our community. We are lucky that we are surrounded by Lake Winnipeg and that we have gorgeous beaches to enjoy when the temperature heats up. We hope residents have found ways to stay cool inside and while they enjoy the outdoors.

The hot, dry weather means that our Fire Ban is still in effect. That means no open fires and no

Fire Permits will be honoured or approved until the Ban is lifted. Fireworks are not permitted in our municipality. There is also a backcountry travel ban from the Province in effect, so no ORVs should be operating anywhere.

Please be vigilant and ensure that you know how to protect yourself in case of a fire or emergency. The municipality has written two Evacuation Plans with the help of our Emergency Con-

Copies of both plans are available at the Summer Information Office and during business hours and at Anderson's Septic Office beside the Post Office at the VB Community Centre.

Please read and review it with your family, print it, fill it in and have it in a handy location in your residence. Ensure you have a 72-hour kit ready.

We encourage all residents to sign up for our emergency contact service, VB Connect. You can decide how we reach you in an emergency – via your cell phone, text, land line and/or email. We also use this service to send out newsletters and other updates to residents. The registration button for VB Connect is near the bottom of the main page on our website, www.rmofvictoria-

beach.ca or you can contact the RM office at 204-774-4263 or toll free in Manitoba at 1-800-513-3839 for assistance. Follow our RM of Victoria Beach Facebook page for factual updates and information.

A couple other reminders to residents:

Property tax and water utility payments are due in the RM office in Winnipeg by no later than July 31, which is a Saturday. The office is not open on Saturdays so please plan accordingly.

The path between Arthur Road and the tennis courts, just off of 5th Avenue, is a narrow foot path. Updated signage will be installed soon that reminds users that bikes are not allowed. For the safety of pedestrians, we thank you for your cooperation.

Upgrades are currently being made to the stairs at Bayview #3, Redwing, and Clubhouse #2 beaches.

Council discussed surveying and selling 4 municipal road allowances on Gibson at our July 6 Council Meeting. We heard from and listened to area residents and we will not be pursuing this plan.

Bike Day 2021

Hello fellow bicycle fans! Victoria Beach's best bike race returns in 2021 with a few changes to ensure we are following the current Public Health restrictions. The Bike Race will be held on July 24th.

***This year, as part of an effort to reduce group sizes - we are asking race participants to register in advance of the race. Please email your child's name, age, and gender to vbbikeraces@gmail. com before the morning of July 24th. Your child will be provided with a helmet number upon arrival at the sports field on the morning of July 24th. Please do not show up to register until 10 minutes before your child's age group start time.

This year, the bike races will begin at 9:30 am, starting with the youngest age group. The other age group start times will be as follows:

- 9:30 am Age 4/5 and under (both boys and girl's categories)
- 9:45 am Age 6/7 (both boys and girl's categories)
- 10:00 am Age 8/9 (both boys and girl's categories)
- 10:15 am Age 10/11/12 (both boys and girl's categories)
- 10:30 am Age 13 to 18 (both boys and girl's categories)

In an effort to keep our numbers as low as possible, we are also asking that parents limit the number of accompanying family members as much as is possible, preferably one parent per family. In lieu of gathering at the sports field to cheer on participants, we are asking that families and other cottage occupants to instead spread out along the course to cheer on the children racing hard along the course – tour de France styles!

If we are all able to do our part to reduce the numbers of people gathering at the sports field, we should be able to limit our group gathering sizes to the prescribed maximum of 25 people on public property. If not, race organizers may be forced to ask people to leave the sports field to ensure we adhere to these restrictions. Please do your part to help us run a safe event for all participants this year.

We are also looking for volunteers to assist with the race this year and in future years. If you are able to assist our team with this event, please send us an email to vbbikeraces@gmail.com and we will contact you with further details on when and where you can participate and support this fun event.

VB Library News

Hi VB!

We recently had someone come into the library asking how we started reading and how to get other kids to read more. We can all agree that a book is at the very least equally entertaining as a movie or TV show, so what draws kids away from books? While digital vs print is a completely different debate and something I won't get into right now, I think there are some valuable lessons to be learned from the mass consumption of digital media, especially by teenagers. No one forces a kid to log onto Netflix and start bringing their favourite tv show, and no one demands that their child watch a certain number of minutes of content each week, yet countless youth still consume hours upon hours of digital content each week. So why is that when it comes to books, where these 'supportive' measures are in place, that youth suddenly stop their seemingly endless consumption of content?

As I am sure most of you have guessed by now, my belief is that forcing reading down the throats of youth is not the best way to get them to read, although it might work for some people. This ultimately takes the fun out of reading as it becomes more of a chore than a leisure activity. Instead, I propose making books accessible as one would make sports accessible to their child: provide ample opportunity to engage in the activity but never force it. Another way to encourage reading is to read books as a family, akin to how one would watch movies with their family. How this is executed is up to you, the point of this is purely to enjoy a story

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with others and potentially open a gateway to multiple meaningful discussions about characters, plots or reading in general.

Finally, I'll give one last piece of advice: rewards shouldn't be necessary to promote reading, finishing a good book is a reward in itself. However, if you were to notice your child reading more than usual, there's no reason why you shouldn't celebrate that with some kind of reward. Just stay away from weekly or monthly targets that make reading feel like a chore or forced activity.

Book club started this past week. We'll be continuing on Saturdays at 1 for ages 10-14.

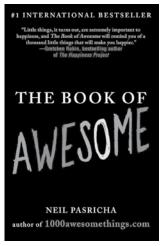
We're starting a candy jar guessing competition. For each visit to the library you will get an entry to guess the amount of candy in the jar and another one if you return all your books on time!

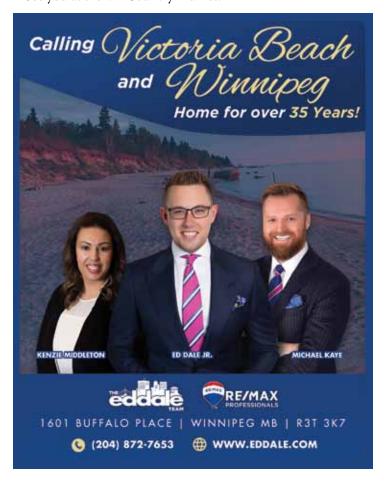

VB Tennis Capital Campaign -

What Legacy Do You Want for the Next Generation?

When I have guests come to VB to play tennis, they marvel when I tell them that we have perhaps the largest tennis membership (700+) in Canada. I often wonder what would have happened if the first tennis community some 100 years ago had not had the foresight to build the original courts at the beach. Then, some 50+ years later, a new tennis generation stepped up and had the foresight to fundraise and create an additional three courts. At the time, the six courts made Victoria Beach one of the largest facilities in the province. As we have seen, the courts are very well used, and tennis is alive and well at VB thanks to those who came before us. Now it's our turn.

Are we up to the challenge to keep tennis at the forefront for the next generation of players at VB?

The need for a rebuilt tennis facility is URGENT, as the six courts have noticeable heaves and cracks that are beyond repair. Some of the courts may be taken out of play as early as next year, placing added wait times for play. We are halfway to our goal of \$550,000. If you play at our VB tennis facility and haven't contributed yet, please consider doing so. If you gave in 2020, we would appreciate that you keep the campaign front and centre as part of your giving strategy for 2021. If you bought a brick last year, another \$250 brick for this year and then again for the next, will help us reach our goal. 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In 2019, over 200 lake lovers participated in our largest and most successful VB & District Walk for Water to date, raising awareness and over \$40,000 for the Lake Winnipeg Foundation (LWF). Sadly, the walk was cancelled in 2020 due to COVID-19. However, we are excited to bring back this important event this summer and look forward to seeing people of all ages join us once again! LWF staff will be on hand to share information about Lake Winnipeg and answer questions you may have.

What's new for this year:

-The 2.5 km Walk for Water will start and end on the Village Green, rain or shine. (We will stop if there is a risk of lightening.) Check-in starts at 9:45 a.m. As needed, we will adapt the walk into smaller groups with staggered starts.

-Thoughtful consideration has guided planning an event that adheres to all public health regulations and optimizes safety.

-We encourage you to wear your LWF t-shirt if you have one. New t-shirts will be available while supplies last for those who don't have one.

-Face masks are not required since we will be outside but if you feel more comfortable wearing one, please do so. Hand sanitizer will be available, and social distancing will be facilitated for participants from different households.

Why participate?

We receive many inquires about how the money raised at the Walk for Water is used. All proceeds are donated to LWF. This funding supports ongoing advocacy and action focused on evidence-based solutions to address phosphorus loading, which is the root cause of potentially toxic algal blooms. LWF's Lake Winnipeg Community-Based Monitoring Program is just one example of this vital work.

Data for decision-making: The Lake Winnipeg Community-Based Monitoring Network

To reduce phosphorus loading, we need to know how, when and from where phosphorus is reaching Lake Winnipeg. The Lake Winnipeg Community-Based Monitoring Network (LWCBMN) coordinated by the Lake Winnipeg Foundation, engages citizen volunteers to collect water samples across Manitoba using scientific protocols in order to measure phosphorus concentration.

LWCBMN's citizen-generated data is used to identify phosphorus hotspots – localized areas that contribute higher amounts of phosphorus to waterways than other areas.

The value of a nimble and responsive network of volunteer citizen scientists was highlighted in 2020, when COVID-19's arrival in Manitoba coincided with the spring melt, a critical season for sampling. LWCBMN protocols were quickly adapted to protect volunteers and comply with all public health recommendations. While many centralized monitoring programs across the country were not able to collect samples, LWCBMN was able to maintain its activities and ensure data continuity.

LWCBMN's sixth field season began in spring 2021, with more than 70 volunteer citizen scientists and 10 watershed district partners collecting water samples from over 135 sites across the watershed. The network has once again expanded and now includes additional coverage in the Assiniboine River watershed and Winnipeg River system.

Continuity is key with long-term monitoring data, and LWF is committed to coordinating LWCBMN activities over the long term. The reoccurring phosphorus hotspots identified through LWCBMN point to meaningful trends in phosphorus loading. Targeting remedial action in hotspots will reduce the amount of phosphorus entering Manitoba's lakes and rivers and improve the health of Lake Winnipeg.

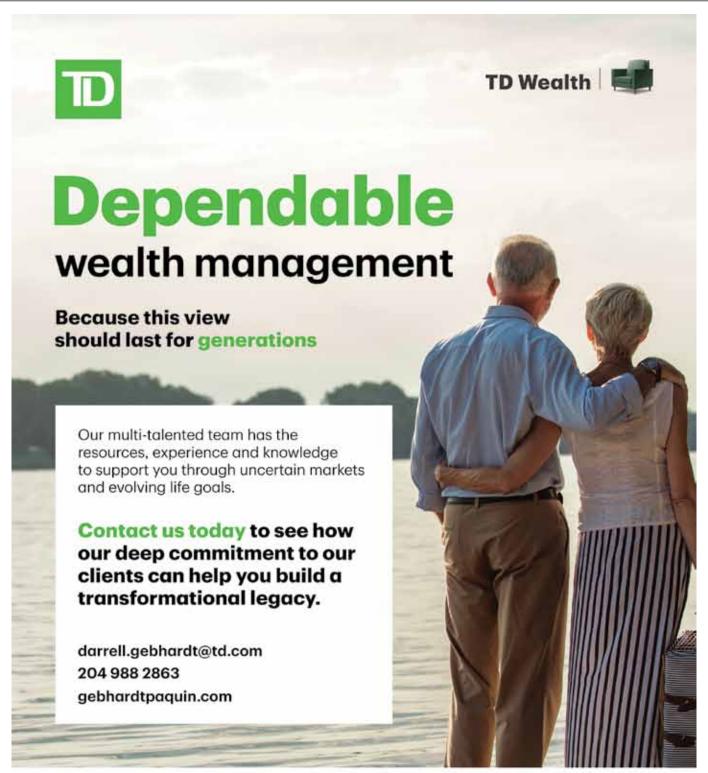
