

First up, we'd like to advise our friends in Wanasing that there is an error about garbage pick-up in your area. The correct information is as follows –

"Please be advised that garbage pickup for your area (Wanasing) is Wednesdays from June 27 – September 9th 2020. Starting the following week after, Wanasing will be back on the regular winter schedule of Mondays. Please make sure your garbage is out no later than 8:30am on your day of pickup to avoid being missed."

Highway Traffic Act Section 109.1(2)

When approaching or passing emergency or designated vehicle stopped or engaged in prescribed activity and using emergency lamps or other required equipment, fail to:

RMVB Garbage Pickup Summer Schedule

Door-to-Door pick-up is as follows (June 29 to Sept. 9, 2020): MONDAY - Albert Beach, all areas south of Arthur Road and west of Ateah Road, including Ateah Road

> TUESDAY - All avenues in Restricted Area north of Arthur Road including Sunset Boulevard

WEDNESDAY - Municipal garbage enclosures in all areas. Garbage is to be placed in garbage bags and left in containers (preferably bear-resistant ones). Containers are to be placed in the front yard - not on the road allowance - by no later than 8:30 am. PICK-UP IS FOR HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE ONLY.

TRAVERSE BAY LANDFILL: PTH#11 - 3 miles east of PTH#11 & #59 intersection. Summer Hours OPEN DAILY - 9 am to 5 pm. A pass is required, they can be picked up at the gate, public works, or the municipal office.

ROSEMARY SCURFIELD

Rosemary was born in Winnipeg and lived in the River Heights area. She spent her childhood on Carpathia Road and eventually moved to Oxford Street. Rosemary attended Carpathia School, J.B. Mitchell, and Kelvin High School. She graduated from the University of Manitoba with a degree in Human Ecology.

Growing up, Rosemary spent summers at her family cottage at Victoria Beach. She was lucky to continue spending many more summers there, at 301 7th, with Bob, Cam, and Corey. Rosemary played a variety of sports, and over the years became an avid and skilled tennis player. She built many lifelong relationships with her tennis group at Victoria Beach, along with her friends at the Winnipeg Winter Club.

Surprising herself, Rosemary also became an accomplished creative artist. She focused initially on stained glass, and then moved on to produce an extensive portfolio of works in fused glass. Rosemary's glasswork is truly beautiful. As a result - and despite her modest approach - it has become highly desired and admired. Her work has been featured in the Boreal Shores Art Tour, Lacosse Gallery on Lilac, St. Peter's Church Emerging Artists Show and Sale, and many home showings.

Knowing Rosemary was to know her Westies, too. Those noisy, loyal, loving little dogs - Bonnie, Murphy, Piper and Logan - were a key part of who she was.

In these past months, whether through calls, visits or cards from friends and acquaintances, the words used to describe Rosemary include "sweet, endearing, calm, graceful, beautiful, gentle, strong and creative". Quietly, but fiercely loyal to her boys, and proud of them, she has instilled in them strong values and principles as they developed into the skilled, capable young men they are today. She will be deeply missed.

"... For Lake Winnipeg": Dealing with Winnipeg's Sewage Problems



Many Manitobans look forward to heading up to the lake each summer. This summer (given COVID-19 safeguards and restrictions), a trip to the lake may be the only opportunity one has to get away for a much-needed break. Imagine, however, if the only time you were able to head to the cabin coincided with a major algae bloom that prevented you from enjoying the beach and the water. That would stink! (Pun intended.)

As many of you already know, phosphorus is the cause of algae blooms plaguing our beautiful beaches. One of the main contributors of phosphorus to waterways is human sewage (in addition to fertilizers and animal manure). The single largest source of phosphorus to Lake Winnipeg is Winnipeg's north end sewage treatment plant. Not only is this treatment plant the largest single contributor of phosphorus, but it is the fourth largest phosphorus polluter among all sewage treatment facilities in Canada. The average phosphorus concentration of discharge water from the north end sewage treatment plant was 3.54 milligrams per litre in 2017, which is substantially greater than the provincial regulatory limit of 1 milligram per litre.

In 2019, the Lake Winnipeg Foundation (LWF) released an interim solution for phosphorus reduction at the north end sewage treatment plant. Their plan laid out a timely and cost-effective mechanism to

enable the plant to meet its provincial phosphorus limits. When the city initially rejected LWF's plan - in the midst of last year's horrible algae blooms - concerned citizens took up the charge. Lake lovers came together to call for change and demand action for our lake.

Our collective concern and frustration were enough to make city sewage treatment a provincial election issue last September. Then, in October, Winnipeg's City Council made a commitment to implement a phosphorus-reduction solution at the treatment plant. In December, the Manitoba government refused to extend the deadline for plant upgrades, requiring the city to come up with phosphorus reduction plans by January 31, 2020. And, both LWF and the Lake Winnipeg Indigenous Collective were asked to sit on the provincial-municipal advisory committee overseeing plant upgrades, participating in four committee meetings before these were suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

On January 31, the City of Winnipeg released their plan to test several options for interim phosphorus removal during the 2020 calendar year. The goal of this testing is to determine how much phosphorus can be removed from the plant's discharge water, given its current operations and configuration. A consultant was contracted to conduct laboratory testing and computer modelling. Unfortunately, this testing was postponed due to the pandemic. Thus, implementation of phosphorus reduction measures at the north end sewage treatment plant will also be significantly delayed.

The City of Winnipeg and provincial government will be updating their January report by September 30, 2020. LWF continues to push for accelerated phosphorous reduction at the treatment plant. We all hope that this updated report will include both accelerated timelines and that every opportunity for reducing phosphorus is being considered and will be implemented as soon as possible. If this is not the case, lake lovers may once again need to speak up on behalf of our lake!

Similar to last summer, if you experience algae blooms at the beach this year, please take a photo to send to your MLA or mayor Brian Bowman (or your city councillor if you live in Winnipeg). Consider posting your photo on social media with the tag #What The Effluent or #OurLakeCantWait. Our success, as always, lies in our commitment to work together and speak up for change.

VB Community Church – A Look Back: The 1930s

The 1930s saw the Victoria Beach Community Church (and worship in general) grow at the Beach. At the beginning of the Depression, church life continued as it had during the early growth years of the 1920s: the Victoria Beach News (the precursor to the Herald) was able to report in 1931 that the Community Church had attracted one of its largest attendances ever for a July service.

But, as the Depression went on, its affects could be felt throughout the Beach, as it had everywhere else. People were not travelling as much, nor did they have the wherewithal to rent (or buy) cottages in resort communities. By 1934, and just prior to the Community Church's Annual Meeting, the Church Treasurer was worried that the offerings taken that year would not be sufficient to meet the church's financial obligations for the cost of running its church services. The Herald during these years often reported on the 'numbers': the number in attendance on a Sunday morning, as well as the offering received. An early July 1935 news item reported that the service had counted 93 in attendance, with a collection amounting to \$7.03, while expenses for using the Clubhouse on Sunday mornings was \$12.00 for rental of the building, piano and caretaking services. In 1937, the Herald encouraged previous Community Church attendees to attend services again and "make it their duty to attend. The community church has been a powerful influence for good."

Still, the Community Church was still able to attract an admirable roster of Sunday morning speakers from large Protestant Winnipeg congregations, (including the Rev. Stanley Knowles in 1934), who were primarily Anglican, United Church, Presbyterian and Baptist in denomination, but that was not always the case. In 1933, the Herald announced that a late summer service was to be led by Miss Mildred McMurray, a leader in the Oxford group (having gotten its name from Oxford University in England and which sought to bring the Anglican Church more in line with its Roman Catholic roots in its theology, and distance it from its more protestant leanings).

Church life was still a prominent feature of beach-life during this time. Aside from the Community Church, Roman Catholic services were being conducted in Ateah's (presumably Transfer) Office in the townsite by 1932. Catholic Mass by 1937 had moved to the Canadian Legion Hall but would eventually return to the Clubhouse. In 1931 it was announced that an interdenominational children's mission had been started, to provide 'wholesome activities, including singsongs, games, religious services, hikes and bonfires'. An opening event in 1932 attracted 150 adults and children to Patricia Beach.

For the first time in almost a century of worship at Victoria Beach, the Community Church is unable to gather in 2020 due to provincial pandemic regulations and social distancing requirements. We hope to meet again in 2021, and you are most welcome to join us then! Have a wonderful Victoria Beach summer!
