
Congratulations to Sheila Ruben and Ken Capelle, 2022 VB Bridge Tournament Champions


In fact, leaves are a friend of the forest and should NOT be raked up at all. Their retention on the forest floor provides all sorts of

good things for the environment:

moisture retention, weed deterrence, microorganism habitat enhancement, nutrient provision, pH stabilization, etc., etc.

At our Victoria Beach cottage, four decades of deliberate leaf retention, supplemented by the addition of native fruits, seeds

and plants, has converted a sparse, sandy wasteland into a wonderful leafy, greenspace, favoured by wildlife, and providing a calmingly, beautiful aesthetic for us to enjoy.

The end of July is just around the corner. Summer moves too quickly and we hope our residents and visitors have been able to partake in some of the many and varied offerings in our community. We are fortunate to have so many people willing to step up and provide the myriad of services and opportunities available to us, all year round. Thank you and remember to support local!

Brush Pick-Up: Brush pick-up has been completed by Public Works in all areas of the RM. Contractors are responsible for taking the brush you hire them to take down or remove to the Traverse Bay Landfill. Residents cannot leave brush on the roadside during the summer months, keep it on your own property or arrange to have it taken to the Traverse Bay Landfill. Next municipal brush pick-up is October 17-31.

Dogs: Every year we get complaints and concerns about dogs off leash, dogs misbehaving and dogs on the beaches. The majority of our beaches are public however dogs are not welcome on the beaches between 10 am and 8 pm and they are always supposed to be on a leash. Not all folks love dogs, some are fearful of dogs, and not all dogs, whether friendly or not, behave in a friendly manner around other dogs or people. Please also pick up after your pets.

Zoning By-Law Update: A reminder to residents of the Public Open House this Saturday, July 29, 2023 from 1 to 3:30 pm at the Social Scene, hosted by Landmark Planning. We recently hired Landmark to help us get the Zoning By-Law complete. They have received community comments to date, and they want to hear your concerns and to clarify any questions you might have about the contents of the new Zoning By-Law. Please take the time to attend this informal session and ensure your voices are part of the solution to completing the long overdue Zoning By-Law for our community.

Tips for young Victoria Beach Sailors from a Baby Boomer

I happened to drop by the Victoria Beach Yacht Club the other day and was delighted to see so much activity. The youth sailing school was in full swing, some Catamaran racers were enjoying a beverage on the deck after a hectic morning of races, and Commodore Brad Scott and Dan Schott were actively inspecting the impressive renovations to the Junior storage facility.

This vibrant sailing scene reminded me of my early years sailing at Victoria Beach in my beloved, and now very leaky, Laser. As there are a number of young parents now actively engaged in the weekend races, I thought I would offer several tips and practices that I followed when I engaged in the weekend races when I was a father of 3 young children.

In the 1980s and 90s there was a comparatively large fleet of Lasers , Hobie Cats and assorted dinghies engaged in the racing series every Saturday and Sunday mornings. My guiding principle on most race days was to minimise my front-end preparation before the race meeting, usually held at 10 AM. After a raucous family breakfast, I would bike quickly to the sailing compound, grab my sailing gear from the locker, and bribe my eldest child Jamie to help me with the rigging. This usually meant skipping the race meeting which was no big deal because I never understood the tactics in the first place.

My fundamental tip for racers today, like in anything, is to acquaint yourself with the practises of the most accomplished practitioners. In my racing career, my hero was a superb sailor named Orest Dackow, who was always immaculately prepared. I would pull my Laser alongside Orest's and duplicate his rigging as closely as possible. Following the Skipper's meeting, I would

ask Orest to have a look at my setup while I retreated to the bathroom.

If my children were on the beach at this stage, which was rare because they far preferred all the Victoria Beach activities, I would play with them on the shore until it was time to head for the starting marker • from time to time offering encouragement to Orest as he re-rigged my boat.

And then, into the Laser I hopped.

Sailing a Laser on Lake Winnipeg on stormy days was thrilling and sometimes outright frightening. Another tip that I would offer young racers is to be extra friendly, polite, and considerate to the folks in the crash boat – bribe them, if necessary. On more than one occasion, I would find myself tipped over, my rudder floating away, and my life jacket stuck on my head. Thankfully, the rescue vessel was always there to get me straightened out. I loved those guys in those crazy moments.

On the other end of the weather spectrum, when the wind died, I had a fundamental rule: get back to shore. There is nothing worse as a young parent to be becalmed, far from shore, and wondering if you would make it home to help out with the kiddos – and also for lunch If I got any hint of dying breezes, I would abandon the race and, using my rudder as a scull, head back to the sailing club. Upon landing, I would derig my boat (in a detailed, organized manner, mind you – so as to be well-prepared for the next weekend's race), haul the Laser back into my berth, and skedaddle back of the cottage as fast as possible.

Yes, those races bring back fabulous memories. While I never won any races, the camaraderie of my fellow sailors and the unique thrill of being totally out of control as you jived around the leeward mark, made it all so worthwhile.
















Advocacy Success!

Renewed federal funding for Lake Winnipeg – and how you can help ensure new spending delivers results

People working together have great power to influence change. And, as we saw this spring, our collective efforts to protect Lake Winnipeg are making a difference.

The 2023 federal budget was released on March 28, and included a commitment of \$650 million over 10 years for a national Freshwater Action Plan aimed at protecting Canada's freshwater lakes and rivers, Lake Winnipeg included.

This announcement answered the call for renewed federal investment made last summer by members and supporters of the Lake Winnipeg Foundation (LWF) who sent postcards distributed by LWF to Canada's Environment and Climate Change Minister Steven Guilbeault.

A huge thanks to everyone who took the time to fill out a postcard at the 2022 Walk for Water, or who mailed in the postcard included in your LWF newsletter. Your actions made this success possible!

Budget 2023's funding commitment is significant – but it's also just the beginning.

Still unknown is exactly how much of the total funding announced in March will be allocated to support regional efforts to protect Lake Winnipeg. Equally important? Ensuring that federal money is invested in ways that will generate measurable phosphorus reduction and long-term impact on the health of the lake.

LWF is calling for a federal funding program for Lake Winnipeg that:

- uses data generated by the Lake Winnipeg Community-Based Monitoring Network to target phosphorus-reduction projects in phosphorus hotspots
- supports Indigenous peoples in reclaiming and restoring their relationship with water; and
- effectively monitors progress to make sure funded projects are achieving expected results.





Police CSO

Hello everyone.

In issue number 2 of this season's Herald I provided information regarding e bikes from BILL 36;THE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC AMENDMENT ACT.

SECTION 145(4) states:

HELMET REQUIRED: POWER ASSISTED BICYCLES.
NO PERSON SHALL RIDE OR OPERATE A POWER
ASSISTED BICYCLE ON A HIGHWAY OR BICYCLE
FACILITY UNLESS HE OR SHE IS WEARING A PROPERLY
FITTED AND FASTENED PROTECTIVE HELMET.

There has been some confusion about what constitutes a "highway".

The TRANSPORTATION ACT defines a "highway" as follows:

HIGHWAY INCLUDES (a) every highway within the meaning of the Transportation Act (b) every road, every street, lane or right of way assigned or intended for use for the general passage of vehicles.

I hope this clarifies the matter.

On another note I would like to share my observations of late with regard to cyclists in general.

After observing a few cyclists disregarding a traffic device, in these cases a stop sign, I monitored cyclists at 3 different locations in the VB Restricted area to get an idea of how common or not this was.

50 of 50 cyclists observed failed to stop and the majority did not attempt to slow down. In several instances children were accompanied by one or both parents.

Vehicular traffic is suspended in the Restricted Area at this time of the season as we all know, however there are contractors , public works, police vehicles that still access the Restricted area.

I will speak directly to the parents and appeal to you to lead your children by example.

Accidents are usually preventable.

Cycle safely!
