



VB - The Musical 2019 - How It Happened!

ONE HUNDRED PEOPLE CAME TOGETHER TO CELEBRATE THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF the RMVB.

In a remarkable feat of determination and drive, two talented women joined forces to create and produce a musical that depicted 100 years of history with a sense of commitment and devotion to this place we call our summer paradise. Margaret Murray Haddad, a permanent resident of 12+ years, and Joanne Parker Gibson, a cottage owner with ties going back a generation, decided to bring their two visions of the beach together by collaborating, researching and reaching out.

Joanne Parker Gibson and her husband have been "VBers" since childhood, eventually purchasing a cottage of their own on 4th Avenue. Steeped in history, her husband's great uncle was Reeve in the early 1950's. That is who Gibson Drive is named after.

Margaret Murray-Haddad came to Victoria Beach with her husband who had always wanted to return to, where as a young boy, he came with his Lebanese grandmother and stayed with the Ateah family. Purchasing the home known as "The Gregory home" was like joining a more recent history. Jack and Dorothy Gregory were two very active and well-regarded community volunteers. That is what Victoria Beach is all about.

Joanne and Margaret knew each other 40 years ago, when Joanne was teaching in Fort Garry and Margaret's sons were her students. The collaboration on a musical to celebrate the RM's Centennial started as an idea hatched during a casual walk through the VB Country Market in the summer of 2018. Excitement escalated as people reconnected with friends they had not seen and had endless stories to share. Why not capture those memories? And so they did!

CAPTURING THE MEMORIES

What started as a simple "Let's do something to celebrate the Centennial", became a labour of love for both Margaret & Joanne. What was important to them as well, was to try to bring a sense of community and healing to a place that had been challenged, experiencing turmoil for a variety of reasons. What became evident to them early on was that Victoria Beach was steeped in traditions, many of which were an inevitable part of the VB cottage experience, but there was another view of VB that came from the pioneers who, generations before were immigrants from many countries looking to eke out a living for their families.

Back in September of 2018, Joanne and Margaret started to draft out how this musical would come together. They started with



an afternoon interview with some of the descendants from the original families (Diana & Larry Ateah, Helen Trainor, Earl Olafson, Tirzah Ateah.) That day laid the groundwork, as each family offered up stories and reading material on which the first part of the musical was based. Joanne's long-time involvement with the Victoria Beach Club helped in researching the story of the original Victoria Beach Company along with personal input from Don & Gail Green, Graham Randle, John Gibson, Ron Hampton, Kathy & Glenn Halgren, Helen & Keith Black, Greg Thomas & Sheila Grover and Kathy Grover, among others.

A wealth of historical information was easily revealed in already written books, such as 100 Summers On Lake Winnipeg (Greg Thomas & Sheila Grover), Cedars of Lebanon (Laela Ateah-Lester), Memories of Victoria Beach (Sam Ateah), From the Falls to Lake Winnipeg (a heritage project 1988 provided by the Halgrens) and 311 First Avenue, some personal happy memories 1921-1960 by Dr. James Mitchell. A special credit is also due to a treasure trove of old Heralds dating back to its early beginnings.

Gathering this background had a two-fold purpose. It became the skeleton script, to which was added all the local color that came next. It also brought to light the over-arching theme of how Victoria Beach became what it was.

Joanne and Margaret were both asked – "How did you manage to do all this and still be speaking to each other?" It was simple. It was recognized immediately where each of their strengths were – they divided the tasks and each had the final say on decisions that were within that area. Early on they recognized that they were both collaborators and passionate about the value of the project.

Overarching objectives were flushed out.... the aim became to involve as many people as possible from everywhere, including children; there would be no political or inside jokes or jabs, everybody needed to have fun and nothing was cast in stone. This allowed for what followed to be as accurate as human memory could make it.

WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

Throughout the winter and spring of 2018-19, Joanne and Margaret met semiregularly, brainstorming ideas for musical numbers, narratives, and collating the research. Joanne provided words to music purchased from ITunes, while Margaret wrote countless versions of dialogue. Collecting photographs began as word spread. Next came an application for funding from the RM Centennial Grant, then sourcing costumes, lighting and sound equipment, scenery, props, and stage requirements. With Joanne's background teaching Drama and Musical Theatre at Vincent Massey Collegiate in Winnipeg, she was able to negotiate, beg or borrow a lot. Some came at a cost. Transport for the sets, costumes, lights & sound equipment was made possible by volunteer truck drivers Laith Gagnon, Danny Gibson and Sandra & Claude O'Orange. Venues for rehearsals needed to be found. Thankfully, space was made available from the East Beaches Social Scene, The Victoria Beach Club, St. Michael's Church, the Victoria Beach Community Centre Club and Margaret's living Room.

Compiling a crew to support all this came next. Out of the blue, a call came from James Culleton, looking to experience, from the ground up, what it would be like to produce a Musical. He became the set builder and the photograph technician who put together

David Gibson volunteered to be Master of Ceremonies and Vic Janzen, with his wonderful moustache, agreed to be the train conductor and story teller, always ready to invite the audience to "Get On Board". Andrew Stelmack and Tom Hope arrived from Toronto to join both the group onstage and behind the scenes and Tom's wife, Michele helped Margaret complete the final touches to the program. Lorraine Cook came in from China to join the group of wonderful story tellers and historical characters - Sharon Bauman, Debb Brethauer, Megan Dyck, Susanna Dul-Buffi, Kathy Grover, Gail Green, Mary McIntosh, Jeannine Rozzi, Nettie & Mark Strople, Dean Ateah, Chris Ford, Ron Hampton, Wolf Kraft, Dave McKibbin, Bruce Morrison, Graham Randle, Bob Suderman and Bill Stewart.

Joanne coerced some of her connections from the beach to pitch in to help on the production side of things – Pat Captain - Music, Brian Hodgson - Sound, John Gibson-Lights, Helen Forrest-Tickets, Nancy Hodgson & Shelley Saunders – Cast Luncheon, Helen Black-Piano and Jennifer Engbrecht- Soloist & Drums.

Margaret got an assistant, Elaine Ford, to keep track of the Costumes, Pat Spangelo joined them as Seamstress and Victoria Stayner-Albl attended every rehearsal acting as Stage Manager while tap choreographer, Marilyn MacKenzie acted as Assistant Stage Manager.

Two casting calls, one in Winnipeg at the Fort Garry United Church and one at the beach at St. Michael's Church produced a group of interested and curious participants. With a script still in its formative stage, singing auditions was the first priority. Joanne had created two sequences with some comic relief for four male singing voices-Mike Bartmanovich, Keith Black, David Gibson and Andrew Stelmack. Then more men stepped up and an actual men's chorus was created. The excitement level rose with each rehearsal. And who knew that Dean Ateah would volunteer to fill a vacant spot as Elvis! One element not to be missed was the importance of including children. Young performers like Dana Lee, Hailey & Sarah Feakes, Alex & Abi Mason, Chayse & Grayce Dube, Izzy & Ben Dyck, Parker Ateah and little Ruby Ateah had the time of their lives and made new "Lake" friends. The musical became a family affair, sometimes spanning three generations like the Whickers. For instance, Keith and Helen Black, some ten years earlier, had written a dialogue called "There's No Place Like It", poking fun at what it is like to have a cottage at the beach. They were thrilled to be able to perform it on stage. Kevin Dube, as "The Tribune" news reporter and our cast photographer put his all into his performance.

The Grover Girls, Greg Thomas and Abi Mason brought their own version of The Teddy Bear's Picnic. Even though there was some question as to whether Greg could carry a tune, even with a picnic basket, it turns out that he could, and did very well - this little piece was one of the highlights of the show as the belligerent bear was transformed into "Smokey" - The Fire Prevention Bear.

As costumes began to accumulate, the East Beaches Social Scene Line Dancers got the chance to dance an old time Charleston, in sequin and fringe, but only if they fit into the costumes available. Additional line dancers who wanted to participate were given Metis sashes procured from a school in Powerview and joined in to dace the "Red River Jig." The Military Uniforms came from the Archives at St. Matthews Minto Barracks Museum.

Victoria Community Beach MerryMakers, led by Lynn Anderson, thought that Margaret and Joanne were kidding with them when they were approached to do a Kitchen Band number but they got right into the spirit, so much so, that they ordered new aprons especially for the occasion. A very fetching and talented Dana Feakes topped the number off singing a rewritten version of Alexander's Kitchen Band, in honour of Alex Anderson.

But nothing could top the four volunteer firefighters (Wolf Kraft, Grant Vialoux, Rick Dickenson and Chris Feakes) who put themselves out there to act and dance up a storm to a rewritten version of YMCA changed to RMVBrescuing a lost dog in the process....promoting the East Beaches Animal Shelter. What a show stopper!

Members of the former and current Municipal Council (Kathy McKibbin, Steve Axworthy, Mike Bartmanovich, Irvin Kumka) led by Fred Buffi, performed a version of I've Been Everywhere...highlighting many of the local streets and ending with a tribute to the new Trails System ... all named with hard to pronounce names sung to the toe-tapping, hand-clapping tune.

A final segment of the performance paid



religious activities that have been undertaken over the years ... the history of the cemetery, the story of Faith Bible Camp, and the numerous services that have been provided by St. Michaels Non-Denominational Church.

On that note, the final few production numbers were preceded by Joanne and Margaret introducing themselves and taking a bow.

Just as the show had opened with a youth soloist, Schaeffer Engbrecht and the youth chorus singing Carved In Stone - a tribute to the Indigenous Peoples sharing the wisdom of the ages, the children's chorus and the entire cast closed the show led by youth soloists Dana Lee Feakes, Chayse Dube, Izzy Dyck, Grayce Dube and Schaeffer Engbrecht singing a wonderful medley of uplifting songs celebrating the peace and the love we all share for Victoria Beach. "O'Siem" - "We are all family"

With jubilation and enthusiasm to spare, the finale number showcased 103 cast and crew members who stepped up on stage or surrounded the "Sold Out" audience to celebrate together their final curtain call to the tune "If My Friends Could See Me Now", happy to have participated in a chance of a lifetime at Victoria Beach.

BUT THE WORK WAS NOT OVER.

Due to the demand for tickets that could not be filled, and the overall pressure to produce a video, the production was recorded. The spirit of this final step was dampened when it was realized that the rolling photo stream was not captured, in favour of keeping the camera focused on the action on stage. Without the photos, the archival value would be lost and there would be unexplained pauses in

tribute in script, music and song to all the the staging. After canvassing the cast and crew, the decision was made to approach a professional videographer, and he, along with Joanne, spent another chunk of time inserting each photo into its timed location, which brought the final product up to a higher standard. A short fund-raising campaign netted the required money to cover this cost. It also allowed for the insertion of some extra footage, including still photos of the rehearsals, stage action, and even the fantastic post-production party hosted by Dean Ateah & Monica White. Now the video was complete and ready to share.

As promised, there will be copies made available on a USB stick for those venues who supported this project, to use as their own fund-raiser this summer or next summer, as soon as it is deemed safe to do so. It is also hoped that sometime this summer the cast will be brought together in smaller groups, by special invitation, to see the show video ... again, when it is safe to do so.

Please know that one copy of the video will be given to the Heritage Committee and one copy will be donated to the Allard Library at East Beaches Social Scene for lending possibly in the fall of 2020. It is important at this time to not provide copies for sale or local distribution this summer in order to retain the integrity and value of this work.

So, for anyone who did not see VB - The Musical last year, you will have your chance. As they say in show business - COMING SOON TO A CLUB NEAR YOU! ... And it is hoped that you will enjoy it as much as the folks who worked on it ... and that it will continue to help bring our community together as one, always.

- (b) Shall not return to the right side of the highway until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle or bicycle

General rules: bicycles and power-assisted bicycles;

Section 145(1) a person operating a bicycle or power-assisted bicycle on a highway or bicycle facility has the same rights and duties as a person driving a motor vehicle on a highway and shall obey all signs and traffic control devices, and all directions of a peace officer.

...For Lake Winnipeg:

A Conversation with Alexis Kanu, Executive Director of the Lake Winnipeg Foundation

1) How has the Lake Winnipeg Foundation had to respond and adjust to new COVID-19 realities?

LWF adapted quickly to the arrival of the pandemic in Manitoba, with all staff transitioning to work from home. The LWF staff team is very dedicated and highly motivated – and we have the support of a very conscientious and caring board – so we've been able to continue much of our work as planned.

Two areas that have required more significant adjustment are our water sampling programs, and our summer events.

Under normal conditions, our staff prepare up to 3000 water sample packs each spring. Assembly of the kits is nearly impossible while practicing social distancing, and subsequent distribution of these kits to over 70 citizen scientists and 20 partner groups would further increase the risk of virus transmission.

Yet many citizen science volunteers were eager to continue sampling. We quickly adapted our water sampling protocols enabling volunteers to collect water samples in plastic drinking water bottles. Of course, we left the decision to sample up to individual volunteers and we're excited to welcome back all volunteers for a regular sampling season in 2021!

Summer has always been the busiest and most exciting season at LWF – we look forward to getting out to the lake, visiting our members in their beach communities, and of course, hosting our signature Walk for Water events. This year, however, to keep everyone safe, we've moved our events online. While we'll miss the opportunity to meet face-to-face, we're excited to try out some new and exciting opportunities.

In 2020, our members' support is as important as ever and I hope you'll get creative in setting up your own personal fundraiser through our '... For Lake Winnipeg' campaign. (Learn more online at lakewinnipegfoundation.org.) And please watch out for our online auctions – the Jets fridge auction in partnership with Saffies General Store ends July 5th!

2) What are some of the big achievements of the Lake Winnipeg Foundation over the past year?

Last year, the Lake Winnipeg Community-Based Monitoring Network grew by leaps and bounds. With 75 citizen volunteers and over 20 partner organizations, we increased monitoring coverage across southern Manitoba. New partnerships with Manitoba Hydro and Ontario Power Generation helped us expand into the Winnipeg River basin and into Northwestern Ontario. Alongside the Gordon Foundation, we launched Lake Winnipeg DataStream, an online platform that enables sharing of community-based monitoring data.

The CBM network consistently identifies recurring phosphorus hotspots – areas that contribute a disproportionate amount of phosphorus to our waterways. With multiple years of citizengenerated data now in hand, we know where the hotspots are – and where to focus our efforts to reduce phosphorus loading. We're sharing this data with federal and provincial decision-makers, in order to improve water protection policies and practices.

In 2019, LWF also released an interim solution for phosphorus reduction at Winnipeg's north end sewage treatment plant. Our plan laid out a timely and cost-effective mechanism to enable the plant to meet its provincial phosphorus limits.



When the city initially rejected our plan – in the midst of last year's horrible algae blooms – our members took up the charge. I was so inspired last year watching the LWF community come together to call for change and demand action for our lake. I've never been more proud to be an LWF member.

3) What future work are you excited about?

I get really excited about opportunities to strengthen freshwater policy. To solve a challenge like Lake Winnipeg, we need action and commitment at all levels – from individual households all the way to the federal government. To me, the actions we decide to take together are incredibly powerful and inspiring.

In 2019, the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Canada was tasked with establishing a new Canada Water Agency to keep our water safe, clean, and well-managed. I see lots of opportunities for this new agency to help secure a healthy future for Lake Winnipeg.

This agency needs to support evidence-based policy and decision-making for clean water, using citizen science alongside government data to manage phosphorus hotspots. The agency also needs to increase interjurisdictional cooperation within the Lake Winnipeg watershed, to effectively coordinate agricultural water management and wetland protection across the prairie provinces. And, from the start, the agency needs to seek out, listen to, and be guided by the knowledge of Indigenous governments and rights-holders from around the lake.

Together with our partners at the Lake Winnipeg Indigenous Collective, this year LWF will be mapping out tangible, meaningful actions that the Canada Water Agency can take to protect and restore Lake Winnipeg. Stay tuned to learn more, and help us ensure our message is heard!

Parking Lot Update

Dear Victoria Beach Residents and Cottagers,

Welcome back to another summer in Victoria Beach. Due to COVID-19, we are facing a truly unprecedented situation this summer. Because of this, we have had to make some necessary changes to put the health and safety of our community first.

Below is some information about what you can expect when you arrive in Victoria Beach this summer:

- 1. Our employees are taking extra measures to guarantee the safety of all VB community members. This includes frequent hand washing, thorough cleaning and sanitization of office surfaces and taxi cabs, and COVID-19 screening before beginning work.
- 2. We have installed POS terminals in the parking lot office as well as in taxis. We are requesting that you pay with contactless credit/debit card when possible.
- 3. Taxi cabs are available, but the driver will be responsible for opening and closing doors and loading and unloading the cab. We are asking that all passengers limit touching surfaces in the cab. We have also installed protective screens between the front and back sections of the cab, and nobody will be permitted to sit in the front seat.
- 4. If a taxi is requested, you will be asked the mandatory COVID-19 questions to ensure the continued health and safety of our employees. We have a safety officer on staff this summer to deal with any questions or complaints.
- 5. For those who do not pass COVID-19 screening questions or are arriving from outside of Manitoba within the last 14 days, arrangements have been made for a taxi driver to escort them to their cabin and back to the lot. This service has a \$15 fee, based on a 20-minute service.

We ask for your patience and understanding as we make these necessary changes to keep our community safe. This is uncharted territory for everyone, and we are doing the best we can.

INFORMATION FOR COTTAGE OWNERS

May 12, 2020

Public health officials advise Manitobans to stay home as much as possible to prevent the spread of COVID-19. When people do go out, they should take steps to maintain social distancing.

If you must travel to your cottage or second residence, follow these guidelines:

- Do not travel if you or any of your family members require medical care or have symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing). If you have any symptoms, use the screening tool at: www. sharedhealthmb.ca/covid19/screening-tool/ before you travel to see if you need to be tested.
- If you or anyone with you begins to feel ill or experiences COVID-19 symptoms, return home immediately.
- Do not use local health providers, unless it is an emergency.
- In the event of a medical emergency requiring evacuation, be sure you can contact local authorities. Emergency contact information varies by region. Ensure you collect and take that information with you before you leave home.
- Public officials have advised people not to travel outside Manitoba, with some exceptions. These rules apply only to travel in Manitoba. Authorities in other provinces control restrictions in those provinces.
