Council Corner

We have had some great weather this year to explore our beautiful community! The trails are open and ready for exploration! Let's just be sure that we do so on foot or a bike. Remember, at this time, all trails in the R.M. of Victoria Beach are for foot or bike traffic only. Come the fall, if you are interested in helping to maintain the trail system, council will be putting together a volunteer list to ensure we keep our trails beautiful for years to come.

Just a reminder to residents to familiarize yourself with poison ivy, poison oak, and poison sumac. All three of these plants grow in our area, so it is important to familiarize yourself with what they look like so that they can be avoided. An itchy summer is not a fun summer!

Council also invites all our residents to consider those of us who have donated their time to serving our community. If you would like to see them honoured for their tireless work, be sure to nominate them for the R.M of Victoria Beach Municipal Volunteer Award! Just go to the Victoria Beach website or use your standard web browser to search "R.M of Victoria Beach Municipal Volunteer Award". Remember, volunteers may be entered even if they are not able to be active this year.

Regarding our four-legged friends, Council would like to remind residents that dogs must be leashed and not allowed to walk of ones property of their own volition as per By-Law 1581. Incidents of dogs off leash should be reported to our dog control officer Dwight Legall: (204) 340-6207. Any barking related issues fall under The Noise By-Law 1593 and should be reported to the Police regardless of the time of day.

As things heat up in the area, and it looks like we may be facing another heat wave in the coming weeks, it's important to remember to remain hydrated and find ways to stay cool. Of course we can access water freely, but our forests can't, and while it may seem to be raining regularly at the beach if one follows the forecasters, in reality, we have seen very little rain for the 3rd year running. This is why it is so important that we:

- work to remove dead or dying trees from our property (with particular attention being made to remove conifers/ evergreens),
- replace these trees with deciduous (leafy) trees at a safe distance from our homes (a minimum of 10 feet), and

- be sure to remove all sources of fuel (anything flammable) from under our cabins.
- All this information can be found in the FireSmart guidelines at firesmartcanada.ca. While you're there, why not take a gander at some gardening sites and find ways to beautify your property? This is a fantastic opportunity to not only make your house safe from fire, but to engage in some very exciting and satisfying landscaping and gardening!

Now for the most popular and reoccurring topic in Council Corner, Garbage! All non-bagged garbage such as appliances, beds, sofas, BBQ's, plates, phones, nursery beds, etc... must be taken to the Travers Bay dump. The R.M. pays for the removal of these materials, and they are not permitted at the RMVB garbage site. Furthermore, please ensure that glass and bags are separated from the large green recycling container. Again, the R.M. of Victoria Beach pays to re-sort that bin if these items are found. This needlessly increases costs, thereby increasing taxes.

Finally, Council would like to thank our residents for keeping up with Covid-19 protocols. Residents traveling from outside the province should identify themselves to the police the day they arrive and the day they have finished their 14-day quarantine. If residents become aware of anyone who is not self-isolating before completing their isolation, the VB Police Department should be notified immediately at (204) 756-2322.



Farewell to a Great Manitoba Music Man

Amidst all of the partiers at the 30+ Dance over the years, one person had just a little more fun than the rest of us.

Nobody looked forward to the highlight of the Victoria Beach social calendar more than Gerry Atwell.

The keyboardist, singer and leader of the Hit Boss Band, which played the dance on numerous occasions, including the last three years, died of a heart attack last November.

A Juno Award winner in 2002 with Eagle & Hawk, he played in countless bands during his career, including the Ministers of Cool, Rockalypso, Voice of Boom and the Fabulous Lemon Swishies.

Gerry had some mobility issues in the last few years but you'd never know it once the first note was played.

He was just as active off-stage in the arts and music community as a board member, mentor, facilitator and contract grant-writer.

The Love Boat dance in 2017 - perhaps the most enthusiastically-received theme of the mid-summer classic - was all his idea, right down to the band dressing like Captain Stubing and planning the set list according to the route a cruise ship would actually travel.

After last year's Pirates of the Caribbean dance, Gerry sent me an email to tell me how much the band loves playing at the V.B. Clubhouse.

"We love this event and the people. Thank you for trusting us with your legendary Over-30 social once again. We know how important this event is for the Victoria Beach community and it was a great pleasure for us to perform for such a fun-loving and expressive group," he wrote.

If there's a better way to describe attendees at a 30+ Dance than "expressive," I haven't heard it.

The gear had barely been packed away when he suggested a couple of possible themes for the next one - a Beach Party or Studio 54. No doubt they would have been classics.

How else can we express ourselves to the architect of perhaps the most fun night of the entire year?

Thanks for the music, Gerry. What we wouldn't do for one more

RMVB Garbage Pickup Summer Schedule

Door-to-Door pick-up is as follows (June 29 to Sept. 9, 2020):

MONDAY - Albert Beach, all areas south of Arthur Road and west of
Ateah Road, including Ateah Road

TUESDAY - All avenues in Restricted Area north of Arthur Road including Sunset Boulevard

WEDNESDAY - Municipal garbage enclosures in all areas. Garbage is to be placed in garbage bags and left in containers (preferably bear-resistant ones). Containers are to be placed in the front yard - not on the road allowance - by no later than 8:30 am. PICK-UP IS FOR HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE ONLY.

TRAVERSE BAY LANDFILL: PTH#11 - 3 miles east of PTH#11 & #59 intersection. Summer Hours OPEN DAILY - 9 am to 5 pm. A pass is required, they can be picked up at the gate, public works, or the municipal office.

"... For Lake Winnipeg": Monitoring Phosphorus throughout the Watershed

Phosphorus, the nutrient causing algae blooms, comes from human sewage, fertilizers, and animal manure. In last week's Herald, we discussed the largest point source of phosphorus for Lake Winnipeg: Winnipeg's north end sewage treatment plant. This week, we will talk about how we can better understand the distributed sources of phosphorus affecting Lake Winnipeg.

Agricultural fertilizers and manure are spread over large areas of land, and consequently are considered distributed sources (or non point sources) of phosphorus. This makes managing phosphorus release from these sources very challenging. Consequently, the Lake Winnipeg Foundation (LWF) developed a monitoring network to better understand the areas in the watershed contributing high amounts of phosphorus to Lake Winnipeg.

This phosphorus-monitoring program is called the Lake Winnipeg Community-Based Monitoring Network. The network is made up of citizen volunteers and water professionals across Manitoba who collect water samples according to scientific protocols. LWF then tests the samples in the laboratory to determine phosphorus concentrations and calculate the amount of phosphorus being exported off the landscape. This information is used to identify phosphorus 'hotspots', which are locations contributing higher amounts of phosphorus to local waterways than other areas.

In 2019, over 2,000 water samples were collected from 161 sites. The primary focus of the network is sampling the waterways in the Red River Valley, as 68% of phosphorus entering Lake Winnipeg enters via the Red River. In 2019, the network was also expanded to include sites in the Winnipeg River system, which is the second largest contributor of phosphorus (15%).

The phosphorus hotspots identified in 2019 were consistent with hotspots observed in 2016 and 2017. (See image of the hotpot map with the red areas indicating high phosphorus contributions.) Long-term monitoring (i.e. over multiple years) allows for the identification of patterns that persist over time. The main difference between 2019 and previous years was the timing of the high phosphorus concentrations. Wet fall conditions led to significant late-season runoff, whereas in previous years, the majority of runoff (and consequent phosphorus contribution to waterways) occurred during the spring snowmelt.


Unfortunately, the 2020 field season coincided with the arrival of COVID-19. LWF quickly changed its sampling plans to protect the health of the volunteer samplers and comply with all public health recommendations. To minimize physical contact, sampling equipment was not distributed. Instead, those still interested in sampling were instructed on how to assemble their own sampling kits using plastic drinking water bottles. Even though 2020 will not be a typical sampling season, the network continues to see amazing support from its volunteers allowing LWF to maintain some data continuity through challenging circumstances.

As the network collects more information on phosphorus hotspots in Manitoba, LWF plans to use this data to inform ways to decrease phosphorus in our waterways. LWF started the Agricultural Water Stewardship Program last year to identify the agricultural practices that successfully reduce phosphorus runoff to waterways. The success of these practices will be determined by comparing phosphorus data from the monitoring network to the agricultural practices being used by local watershed districts. Together, the community-based monitoring network and the agricultural stewardship program aim to decrease phosphorus entering Lake Winnipeg!

A Cautionary Tale

On Thursday evening July 16th I thought lake Winnipeg was going to swallow me up. The scariest thing happened to me. We have a cottage at Victoria Beach, but I took my two boys and my 12-year-old nephew to Grand Beach for a change of scenery and to do some shopping on the boardwalk.

I love to do laps on my own when I'm in the lake, it's a nice change of pace for me from teaching Boot Camp at VB, aerobics & doing land exercises.

Something very scary happened to me while I was out on the lake doing my laps. My nephew was swimming a little bit behind me and my boys were on the beach. I was swimming on my front & when I lifted my head above the water to take a breath of air I breathed in water, right into my lungs. Now I have swallowed water before, and I even choked on water but I knew something was terribly wrong when I couldn't breathe. My nephew noticed the panic look on my face and asked if I was "OK" I couldn't breathe I couldn't talk, I tried to inhale and instead it was more of a wheezing sound that got louder with each agonizing breath I tried to take. I tried to cough but I was more concerned about getting oxygen. My nephew looks scared so I just put my hand up as to say "wait a moment" and I closed my eyes and I breathed in through my nose and was able to get in small amounts of air. I knew I had to keep myself calm because small amounts of air was better than no air because what would happen if I passed out? How would he get me to shore? At this point nobody else knew what was going on. It's hard to say how much time went by before I was able to breathe normal again but I realized I could stand up and put my feet on the ground. Standing upright I'm sure helped clear out my lungs. What would've happened if I wasn't able to stand up? I wasn't even that deep. I walked slowly and calmly through the water back to shore and focussed on my breath. My chest hurt. Eventually I was able to breathe normal even before I got back to shore.

When I sat down I told my boys what happened and the emotions that I felt. I realized that I almost drowned and I was shaking. I am familiar with Pulmonary Edema (water in your lungs) and I didn't have

any of the signs so maybe I should've gone to the hospital to have my lungs checked out but given the fact that my husband was in the city working and I was with three kids I didn't want to bother anybody. I had no symptoms of "secondary drowning". It's very important though that if this ever happens to anybody and they have any of the signs of secondary drowning to go to the hospital. I think what saved my life was having my 12-year-old nephew with me and not wanting him to panic so that really helped me to remain calm and focus on my breath so that I could get even just a little bit of air into my lungs. It wasn't even a wavy day at Grand Beach, just goes to show that Lake Winnipeg can be very dangerous, and this can happen to anybody. I do consider myself a good swimmer but I'm sharing my story with you so that perhaps the next time you go out to swim and do laps in the water that you make sure that someone on the beach is watching you and that you don't go out too far in case you need to be rescued, or that you just never go alone. Most importantly that when you are in distress and it's a matter of life and death that you remain as calm as possible. I enjoy going out into the water to swim laps, I always have but now I am scared knowing that I almost lost my life last week. Please just be aware and be careful out there. What would you tell your children? Even the strongest swimmers can still drown.







VICTORIA BEACH COMMUNITY CHURCH – A LOOK BACK - The 1940s

The Victoria Beach Community Church, as it had when it opened in 1926, and through the 1930s, continued to call the Clubhouse 'home' during the 1940s, although by 1943, it was sharing the facility with the local Catholic congregation. The Catholic fellowship met prior to the Community Church on Sunday mornings, with the Community Church continuing to meet at 11:00 a.m., as had been their practice for many years.

The Herald would often devote the first issue of each season to remind both newcomers and 'veterans' of the many features that made Victoria Beach special. In June 1945, the paper declared the Community Church as one of the "assets of this Beach" and went on to describe how the weekly services were conducted, with congregational singing, the one hour service with dismissal at 12:15 p.m., and a welcoming atmosphere in the cool and commodious hall. It would be a helpful gesture, the Herald noted, for readers to inform the church committee of any vocalists or ministers visiting the Beach during the season. Those thinking of attending the services were assured, in 1948, that the one hour service would be over in plenty of time to allow anyone to meet the incoming train from Winnipeg at the noon hour. The virtues of attending the weekly service was a long-standing theme in the Herald. The services exerted "an influence for good on the people who reside here, in summer cottage or in permanent home. It is, therefore, the duty of all church-goers to attend these hour services and by their presence increase the neighborliness and good feeling which results in such rich blessings to all around", said the Herald in July 1947.

In July 1945, the Herald also noted the passing of W.H. Pratt, one of the early pioneers of the Community Church. He was, the Herald said, instrumental in arranging the first church services at the J.H. Falls Pioneer Store, and later assisted in the rental of a tent for services on a lot at the corner of Arthur Road and Sixth Avenue.

A long-standing practice of the Community Church through the years, has been to ensure that the weekly offerings were fairly and widely distributed. After the 1946 expenses had been attended to (including

a \$60.00 seasonal rental of the Clubhouse and piano), the annual general meeting saw the remaining funds distributed to a number of organizations, including the winter church service at Victoria Beach. The previous year, the Community Church had set aside \$50.00 to help rebuild bombed churches in Great Britain.

For the first time in almost a century of worship at Victoria Beach, the Community Church is unable to gather in 2020 due to provincial pandemic regulations and social distancing requirements. We hope to meet again in 2021, and you are most welcome to join us then! Have a wonderful Victoria Beach summer!
