Council Corner

Rental Properties:

Over the last few years Council has received complaints regarding some rental properties in the community. If you are the property owner, renting your property to someone for a weekend, a week, or the season, it is your responsibility to ensure that the renters know the rules and ways of our unique VB world. Please ensure that your renters have information available to read and review when they arrive. Please ensure that your summer renters:

- are aware of the vehicle restriction times and regulations if your property is in the vehicle restricted area
- know that respect for your neighbours is important at all times of the day or night
- apply for a fire pit permit if they intend to use one on your property
- know when garbage day is, and where the garbage and recycling area is
 - are aware that ORV's are restricted
 - know that speed limits need to be adhered to
- that municipal by-law and provincial statutes can be enforced by the VB Police on a complaints and drive-by basis
- know there are no life guards, no liquor or glass on beaches, no fireworks
- know that dogs must be leashed at all times and are only allowed on beaches between 8 p.m. and 10 a.m.

Vehicle Permits:

Permits to drive in the vehicle restricted area are approved by Council. There are medical permits, business permits, permanent resident permits and day passes. The staff at the Summer Information Office follow our direction but also have discretion to make on-the-spot decisions if they feel a request is warranted. The VRA is unique in Manitoba and we want to keep it that way. Do not abuse your pass if you have one, do not abuse our staff if they won't give you one or question why you need one. These passes are free and they are a privilege but they come with responsibilities and obligations for the safety of all residents and visitors.

Garbage, Garbage: Household discards that should be taken to the Traverse Bay Landfill continue to pile up at the Public Works yard. If you can get your mattress, saggy old chair, broken microwave, decrepit barbeque, expired propane tank or other non-household bagged garbage to this area, you can definitely get it to the landfill which is about 2 or 3 kilometers east of PTH 59 on Highway 11. Landfill passes are free and can be picked up at the Summer Information Office or by calling Public Works.

There are also a number of small businesses in the area that specialize in smaller jobs like hauling large items to the landfill. They would really appreciate your business!

Finally, a big Thank You to everyone who has ordered a bear-resistant bin from the RM. While the RM's bins aren't the only option, please remember that starting in May 2022, garbage will only be collected where a bear-resistant container is used. Our current order of 100 bins has been delayed due to COVID interruptions, but over half have already been spoken for. Please contact Coun-

cillor Bartmanovich at mbartmanovich@victoriabeach.ca to order your bin so that more bins can be ordered ASAP.

If you already have a garbage container that you feel is bear-resistant, please drop Councillor Bartmanovich a line to arrange for us to have a look at it.

IN MEMORY OF JOHN EVANS



John Evans passed away on January 17, 2021. John was the Manager of the Victoria Beach Golf Course from 1990 to 2008 and was the mastermind behind many golf course improvements completed during those 18 years. These improvements included the replacement of all concrete tee boxes with grass tees, extensions and enhancements of some holes and fairways, purchase of new equipment and

automated sprinkler system. John was also instrumental in planning and overseeing the completion of many other operational improvements at the golf course during his tenure.

John managed the golf course like he owned it. He worked many hours, often 6 days a week, on a set contract so all the extra time he put in was at no additional cost to the Municipality. He even had Anna, his spouse, helping out in the clubhouse from time to time.

He was an outstanding money manager, always getting the maximum value for every dollar spent by the Municipality. John closely scrutinized "his" golf course budget and his management skills resulted in annual golf course operating surpluses in most of the 18 years he managed the course.

John's remittances were always in balance with his paperwork, except on one memorable occasion. On that occasion, John brought the week's receipts into the office and handed the envelope to me

which I in turn handed to a co-worker for review. Upon counting the cash, the co-worker indicated to John that he was short \$20, which raised his eyebrows. He promptly took \$20 from his pocket to balance the receipts with the cash. But that wasn't the end of it. The following week John came to the office with another deposit, but this time handed it directly to the same co-worker to check for accuracy while he "purposely" discussed various other matters with me. And wouldn't you know it, after counting and double counting the cash the co-worker advised John that the cash was over by \$20...John seemed surprised. I don't think he was surprised because I'm certain he planted an extra \$20 to satisfy his suspicion. Not a word was ever spoken about it and John was probably convinced after his "test" that the co-worker was honest (which I already knew). That funny moment was a perfect example of who John was – you had to earn his trust and respect.


John was a fantastic person to work with, very knowledgeable, competent and a no-nonsense kind of guy who wasn't averse to questioning how or why an expense was allocated if it had anything to do with "his" budget. But he was always respectful, kind and considerate.

In 2008 the Municipality awarded John a lifetime membership to the Victoria Beach Golf Course in recognition of his outstanding service as Manager of the course. 


