The familiar smell of bread baking, the wack of the tennis rackets, the lapping of the water on the shoreline, or the call of the seagulls; there is a special allure of our lakeside community. But what do we really know about this lake that we love?

Questions:

- 1. How does Lake Winnipeg rank in size in the world? Bonus: the lake's length and width.
- 2. What is the average depth of Lake Winnipeg?
- 3. How many US states and Canadian provinces contribute water to Lake Winnipeg (ie. contain part of lake's watershed)? Bonus: Name them
- 4. Which treaty territories touch Lake Winnipeg?
- 5. What is the Anishinaabemowin word for water?
- 6. What is the name of the UNESCO world heritage site on Lake Winnipeg's east shore? Bonus point: what does the name mean?
- 7. What Canadian research facility demonstrated that phosphorus is the cause of algal blooms in freshwater lakes?
- 8. Which tributary contributes 70% of the total phosphorus load to Lake Winnipeg?
- 9. What is a phosphorus hotspot?
- 10. What's the provincial phosphorus limit for Winnipeg's North End Water Pollution Control Centre? Bonus: What's the name of the chemical being used to successfully meet the phosphorus licence limit at Winnipeg's South End Water Pollution Control Centre?

Answers:

- 1. Lake Winnipeg is the 10th largest lake in the world by surface area. It is about 436 km long and 111km at its widest point.
 - 2. Lake Winnipeg is 12 metres deep.
- 3. 4 provinces (MB, SK, AB, ON) and 4 states (North and South Dakota, Minnesota, Montana)
- 4. Treaties 1, 2, 3 & 5
- 5. Nibi
- 6. Pimachiowin Aki, meaning "the land that gives life"
- 7. The Experimental Lakes Area in northwestern Ontario
- 8. The Red River
- 9. A smaller sub-watershed (within the larger Lake Winnipeg watershed) that contributes a high load of phosphorus to Lake Winnipeg
- 10. 1 mg/L, which Winnipeg's North End Water Pollution Control Centre continues to be in non-compliance. Bonus: Ferric chloride

Summer is here! Welcome back to Victoria Beach.

Hello to everyone, whether you live here, visit often, or come only for the summer!

Patrol Sergeant Audy Recksiedler and I are continuing on this summer in full time positions.

The Criminal Property Forfeiture Act in Manitoba allows for the proceeds of crime that have been seized to be distributed to law enforcement agencies to enhance Policing efforts. An application was made detailing how the E-Bikes would be an effective tool for Police in Victoria Beach. The main points being access to bike trails and for officers to have the ability to attend calls and not be out of breath or fatigued when they arrive. The "Bicycling Culture" in the Vehicle Restricted Zone also played an important part.



Beetle Population Boom! Spruce Sawyer at VB

There's been a recent surge of Facebook posts about a menacing looking beetle with long antennae, often referred to as a "pine beetle" (a colloquial term not to be confused with mountain pine beetle).

This beetle is a white-spotted sawyer or spruce sawyer, also known by its scientific name, Monochamus scutellatus. Native to Victoria Beach, the beetle feeds on spruce, balsam fir, and pine. The adult beetles feed on the twigs and bark of living coniferous trees, leaving areas with no bark that later develop orange blistering.

Despite their feeding on live trees, the main concern in Canadian forestry is the larval stage. The larvae are saproxylic, meaning that they feed on dead or dying wood, commonly along the perimeter of wildfire-burned areas. The larval tunnels ("galleries") are quite large, causing loss of timer value for areas managed for timber harvest. You'll often see the white larvae while splitting conifer firewood.

In addition to wildfire, the larvae also feed on dead and dying conifers that have been stressed by drought, climate extremes, pathogens, and windthrow. These abiotic (non-living) disturbances initiate what is commonly referred to as the "mortality spiral", where a stressor causes the tree(s) to become susceptible to pests and pathogens. Abiotic disturbances can also include construction damage when trees around construction or development are not protected from soil compaction or root/branch loss. Driving a truck or equipment over soils or storing materials

within the yard can cause effectively irreversible degradation of soils that leads to tree and forest stand stress.

Why are there so many beetles this year?

VB was heavily hit over the past few years by a complex of forest disturbances that has initiated the mortality spiral of conifers in the region. In the center of VB, a history of windthrow and aging conifers has resulted in a surplus of dead or dying host trees for spruce sawyers. You can see the characteristic galleries of the larvae and the sawdust at the base of trees as you walk along the forest trails, especially between Hole 2 and Hole 3 and Hole 3 and Hole 4 at the VB golf course.

Forests grow in a successional pattern. In the boreal forest, disturbance is frequent, often in the form of wildfire or windthrow. In a closed-canopy forest, where the tree crowns are touching, the understory growth is limited to what can grow in the shade. When a tree dies or falls in the forest (regardless of whether it makes a sound), it opens the canopy and allows for new species to grow in the sun from the understory.

When I say that we have a "complex" of disturbances at VB, it refers to the combined effects of older conifers, drought and climate impacts, and construction impacts. These abiotic disturbances weaken the host trees to pathogens and pests. Once the tree is dead or drying, the saproxylic larvae of spruce sawyers can feed on the weakened or dead tree, identified by the adult beetle who lays the eggs on the outside furrows of the bark.

How can I save my trees?

The best way to reduce the impact of spruce sawyers is to keep your trees healthy and minimize the impact of the abiotic disturbances. Maintaining the vigor of your trees is the best line of offense to maintain forest health.

This includes watering and caring for your trees. Trees should be watered "deeply", using a hose and allowing water to drain down past the root zone of lawn grasses. Infrequent watering is preferred as you don't want to create a dependence. Trees will grow their roots more deeply to withstand droughts, and you want to avoid impacting that natural process.

If construction is happening on your property, protect your trees from soil compaction or root/branch/trunk damage using fencing. A certified arborist can help you design tree protection zones and minimize construction impacts. Soil degradation is largely irreversible in any short time frame.

Don't Blame the Beetles

Spruce sawyers play an important role in forest ecology in Manitoba. Don't blame the beetles (or yourself) for a tree that has died. They are part of a complex ecosystem that has co-evolved. Living in a forest, the presence of insects is a sign of forest health. In a world of declining biodiversity, take some time to appreciate the forest around us – just from well outside the bite zone of spruce sawyers.

BIKE RULES SAME AS LAST YEAR: Similar to last year, when you arrive at the tennis courts bikes are not allowed to be left in the center area. Please use the bike racks close to 4th Ave (west side of the courts) or the racks outside the southside of courts 4-6.

ORDER ON THE COURT - BASIC TE®NNIS RULES:

- Avoid swearing.
- Don't interrupt games on other courts for any reason.
- Wait until a point is over to walk past a court or retrieve a ball.
- Balls on court: if you are in the process of a rally and a ball rolls into your court and disturbs either you or your opponent, stop playing immediately and call a "let'. Replay the point. If you



can play on safely, return the ball as soon as the point has been completed. Remember, no one wants to be injured and prevented from playing more tennis.

- Good sportsmanship, courtesy and fair play are always expected from players. Shoe tags, shirts and non-marking tennis shoes must always be worn.
- Maximum playing time is 30 min. for singles and 45 min. for doubles.
- Non-members must pay a daily court fee of \$5.

Full tennis rules will be posted at the courts. The Tennis Calendar can be found in the Herald each week, at the courts, or online at victoriabeachclub. com. Shoe Tags are required for everyday play as well as GVS, Round Robin, tournaments, and tennis pro clinics. For kids' lessons and family tennis nights, wrist bands are required but not a shoe tag. Our programming is designed for all levels of players, and we look forward to welcoming you on the courts!

Hi everyone! We are Dave and Lindsay Proteau, the swim convenors for the 2023 season. We are excited for another year of VB swim lessons as we transition into a new swim program, Swim For Life with the Lifesaving Society.

The Victoria Beach Club is an affiliate member of the Lifesaving Society. All instructors hold valid Lifesaving Society instructor and lifeguard certifications. Blake is our Head Swim Instructor, working with the returning instructors Alexis and Chayse and welcoming two new instructors Robin and Paige. Look for their pictures and biographies in an upcoming issue of the VB Herald.

Registration - Sunday July 2nd at 10am

As usual, all registration will be first-come, first-served. Payment is due upon registration. Preferred payment will be debit our credit. Registrations forms will be available on July 1st at the membership blitz. You can pick up a form and complete it prior or you will be asked to fill out a registration form upon arrival. We will have groups of 5 people at a time enter the clubhouse to register. A copy of your VB membership information will be required and we ask for your patience.

*For your convenience, memberships will be available for purchase online prior to registration.

Swim Lesson Information:

We will be transitioning from the Red Cross Swim Program to the Lifesaving Society Swim Program this year as the Red Cross no longer offers their program. Please see the transition chart for which level to register in. Feel free to send us any registration questions prior to victoriabeachswimminig@gmail.com

Preschool levels 1-5, Swimmer levels 1-3 will all be taught at the far end of Club House Beach. Swimmer level 4 and up will be taught off the dock. **NEW THIS YEAR:** To register to swimmer level 4 or higher, and including any program that runs off the swim dock, all participants will be required to complete a swim test on the first day of classes. The swim test will require participants to jump into deep water, be able to comfortably tread water for 30 seconds and swim on their front for a minimum of 25 meters. With the transition to the new program we want to ensure that everyone is registering for the correct level for their skills. This is to ensure the safety of all participants and the instructor guards. The instructors / guards will have final say on all swim tests. If the participant can not preform all skills, it will be the parent / guardians responsibility to find another open spot in a lower level class. There are many skills and stroke progressions that can be mastered in the programs taught off the beach. We appreciate everyone working with us through the transition and understanding that safety in aquatic programming is our number one priority.

Fees and session dates are as follows: Session one: July 3rd to July 21st Session two: July 24th to August 11th

Lifesaving Society Swim for Life Programs - Preschool, Swimmer Level 1-6, Swim Patrol Program and Lifesaving Levels

- Two, three-week sessions at a fee of \$45.00 per session.
- Lessons are ½ hour every weekday.
- Students may be registered for either or both sessions on registration day. Preschool programs are for ages 3-6

Nick Carlson – Tennis Attendant





Council News

The first edition of the VB Herald means summer has officially arrived! Thanks to Editors Kevin Dube and Barb Pritchard and to their advertising and publishing wizard, Lana Meier for once again bringing us the VB Herald. The VB Club and their many incredible volunteers have managed to keep this summer paper going for almost 100 years and we appreciate all that you do for the community.

Council has some important updates to share with our residents and we encourage you to go to our website at www.rmofvictoriabeach.ca for regular updates and information.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING DEPOT: Public Works has been working hard to clear out and clean out their yard in anticipation of opening up the new fenced, staffed, garbage and recycling depot just west of the Public Works yard. All large municipal garbage bins will be located in the fenced compound. Our environmental licence requires that the depot be staffed and hours of operation will be daily from 9 am to 5 pm from May 1 to October 31. From November 1 to April 30 we will be open from 9 am to 5 pm but closed on Tuesday and Wednesday. We can not accept e-waste or household hazardous waste. Signage will be posted at the site to inform residents what can be accepted at the depot and fees that may be charged for certain items. Cameras will be installed and the compound will be locked after hours. We appreciate your patience as we get this new facility up and running.

GARBAGE PASS FOR RESIDENTS: One pass per household for the Traverse Bay Landfill and RMVB Garbage & Recycling site will be mailed to all residents with your 2023 Tax bill. Replacement passes will be \$25. Passes for non-residents will be \$50. Similar to the Traverse Bay landfill, there will be tipping fees for larger items that we then have to take to the landfill.

DOOR TO DOOR GARBAGE PICK-UP: Public Works will not go into your yard to find your bins. Containers are to be placed in your front yard, close to the road allowance but not on the road, by no later than 8:30 am on your pick-up day.

BEAR-RESISTANT HOUSEHOLD BINS: Contrary to the insert with our 2023 Tax Bills we have delayed the requirement for residents to purchase bear-resistant household bins but we strongly encourage the use of bear-resistant bins of some kind. We currently have about 10 bins left at a price of \$225, delivered, please contact the RM office or email Mike Bartmanovich @ mike.bartmanovich@gmail.com to get your bin delivered. Please do your part to ensure wildlife are not adversely impacted by improper garbage storage.

FIRE PIT PERMITS: Permits must be filled out for backyard fire pits. Go to our website under Forms & Documents, Fire Pit Permits at https://victoriabeach.ca/Home/DownloadDocument?docId=b46d4380-39c4-4949-a6ea-6912577b6d6f or pick up a hard copy at the mailbox on the west side of the Firehall. Fire is our greatest risk – please be aware of the dangers and the appropriate use of your back-yard fire pit. If a Fire Ban is in effect no outdoor fires are permitted. Please advise your guests or renters and be fire safe and fire aware.

ORV BY-LAW #1643: After much public debate and discussion, our ORV By-Law 1643 was passed on March 21, 2023. Please go to our website, click on Forms & Documents, By-Laws to review the new regulations on ORV's and snowmobiles or click on the following link, https://victoriabeach.ca/Home/DownloadDocument?docId=c6b3a503-c72f-44fd-85a3-2132de250f74

Maps attached to the end of the By-Law show where and when ORV's may be used in our municipality. Per By-Law 1643, no ATV's may be used within the municipality during a Fire Ban.

SPECIAL EVENT PERMITS: Our VB Police have helped design a Special Events Permit for short term or one-time events that may require leniency for parking or noise or other by-laws that may impact your neighbours or the community. Please go to our website to download the form under Forms & Documents, Special Events Permit, https://victoriabeach.ca/Home/DownloadDocument?docId=b2195f83-ca0d-46e3-b1d0-5ef-5fa78c9f4

VEHICLE RESTRICTED PERIOD & VEHICLE PERMITS:

The vehicle restricted period is in effect in the vehicle restricted area from Thursday, June 22 at 11:59 p.m. until Monday, September 4th at 6:00 a.m. All vehicles must be parked in the VB Parking Lot prior to 11:59 pm on Thursday, June 22 unless special permission or special permits have been acquired. It is a privilege to have a vehicle pass for the vehicle restricted area. Abuse of the passes will not be tolerated and could result in removal of your vehicle permit. Forms are available on our website under Forms & Documents, Vehicle Permit Forms, at https://victoriabeach.ca/p/forms-documents.

ZONING BY-LAW: We are once again discussing the long-overdue Zoning By-Law for our municipality. Council has an FAQ - Frequently Asked Questions sheet for our website, and we are reaching out to associations and individuals who expressed interest in improving the Zoning By-Law. We plan to have meetings with these associations and individuals and to host an Open House once all the information has been gathered on this important by-law. Please stay tuned for further details.

COUNCIL MEETINGS: Council Meetings will be held at the East Beaches Social Scene, #3 Ateah Road at **4:30 pm** on the first and third Tuesday of the month. Join us on July 4, July 18, August 1 and 15.

The Moonlight Inn Rehabilitation Project

An Exciting Future for a VB Landmark

The Friends of The Moonlight Inn Committee were thrilled to see the great turnout at the public open house at the VB Clubhouse on Saturday, June 10. Responses from the large crowd to our plans to rehabilitate the Moonlight Inn were overwhelmingly supportive. The Moonlight Inn was built in 1929 and the structure is in need of some expensive rehabilitation. The Friends of the Moonlight Inn Committee is made up of VB property owners Doug Pollard, Unit7 Architects Dean Syverson and Cleo Syverson, retired engineer Kelly Hearson, Moonlight Inn proprietor Aaron Vincent Elkaim, Gerald Vincent, Councillors Graham Randle and Irwin Kumka and Mayor Penny McMorris. Our municipal Building Inspector Curtis Beaudoin has also been providing critical feedback as have some local contractors. We have been meeting and planning the renovations over the winter. Estimates put the cost of this renovation at \$500,000 plus.


The Moonlight needs to be lifted and levelled. Structural and geotechnical studies have been completed to ensure that the structure is sound enough and the ground is receptive to that happening. The aim of the Committee is to retain as much of the original charm as possible. The stone pillars at the front will likely not withstand the lifting and levelling process but the stones will be kept and reused in replica pillars to be included in the facelift. We will be adding an outdoor side deck just off the ground, taking off the old kitchen addition and replacing it with a new addition that is fire-rated and includes the kitchen and prep area, storage, an office and an accessible washroom. The new deck and the main floor will also be accessible to persons with mobility devices with the use of a new ramp and automatic doors. The ventilation will be moved to the back of the building and some of the kitchen appliances may need to be upgraded but most are in good shape and will be reused.

The second story will be opened up again and seating will be expanded with the removal of the two small rooms at the front. These two rooms form dead-ends which are not allowed by building or fire codes and a new upper walkway will be added above the front door. This will allow for better flow, code adherence as well as access to a new 2nd story outside staircase which provides a required egress from the 2nd floor. A liquor licence is being discussed and the majority of the crowd at the open house were very receptive and appreciative of that possibility. Some folks showed their support by dancing in the aisles! Residents in attendance were also thrilled to hear that we have an anonymous donor who has come forward to cover the costs of this renovation to the Moonlight. This is an incredibly generous gift to the municipality and the future of the Moonlight Inn and we are very grateful.

The plans do not include the old log cottage, we are looking at that as Phase 2 of the reparations. We do know though that the old log cottage is sinking into the ground and the bottom logs are rotting. The whole structure needs some work and a purpose, in the near future.

We hope to start some of the work at the end of this summer. Please stay tuned, check our website for updates or ask a member of the Committee for updates as we move forward.
