



HAPPY JUNE TO ALL! Victoria Beach Club Memberships... it's a hot topic ...to be or not to be ??

Since early fall, many of us have experienced severe restrictions and shutdownsit has been a challenging time. Provincial guidelines have started to ease and we are now allowed a maximum of 5 people outdoors which Tennis Manitoba has communicated to us allows 5 people on a tennis court at a time. This maximum of 5 outdoors and none indoors does not allow us to currently run any activities we normally run aside from tennis. We are hopeful this loosening of restrictions is a positive sign for the upcoming weeks.

While Victoria Beach continues to be the place where we can still enjoy our cottages, bike rides, a game of tennis and the beach, at this very moment the future of programming and what it's going to look like is unknown. The Board, like last year, is having "déjà vu" conversations... discussing what the upcoming beach season will look like and what can safely be offered, and how to deal with changes to the schedules and programs as provincial guidelines change.

In order to take part in any of the Victoria Beach activities, a VB membership is required.

So just like last year, we are strongly encouraging all families to purchase memberships on-line (it's super easy) for many reasons, but mainly to keep the lineups to a minimum, so we can keep within the Provincial Guidelines for social distancing as much as possible. We are currently planning the following pick-ups for memberships:

- 1. July 1 from 10-1, at the parking lot,
- 2. July 4 from 10-12, at the clubhouse.

All Club activities will be dependent on the most up to date COVID 19 guidelines for Manitoba. Any changes of activities and events planned will be posted on our Facebook and Instagram pages as soon as possible.

Please note there will be no door to door canvassing again this year. There will be an opportunity to purchase memberships in person for those who are unable to use the online tool (strongly recommend) starting July 1, with the preferred method of payment of credit and debit.

Refunds will not be issued should programming be severely restricted due to COVID.

The Yacht Club - A History of Fun & Inclusivity



The Victoria Beach Yacht Club & School looms large as the focal point of watersport, sail-based travel, and floating recreation, but like any organization of stature, it has come from a rich and storied tradition. As we look forward to our upcoming summer, welcome new members, and prepare to enrol students, please enjoy this brief look back at the evolution of the VBYC.

Early Days

The VBYC as we know it, was established in 1964 - a sparse collection of lockers and a ragtag compound to keep our crafts (mostly Enterprise and Lazy Dinghies) safe from racoons, other woodland critters, and beachside lovers looking for quick shelter in a moment of particularly intense ardor.

Throughout the 60's the club gained membership and momentum, as the race and property committees were formed to shoulder the club's growing community responsibility. This era also marked the beginning of the Scott Family's dynastic involvement in the club. Tammas and Don Scott held early leadership

posts, which are held to this day by Commodore Brad Scott, and youth prodigy Jack Schott pictured below painting anchors with the righteous dedication of a little Michelangelo at the Sistine Chapel. Victoria Beach golf legend Dick Quinton (Great Uncle of Acting Communications Director Jason Quinton) had taken to the water, continuing the tradition of river-loving Winnipeggers trading muddy banks for our pristine sands in the summer.

The sailing school was founded in 1965, using the "Cadet Dinghy." In the wake of the Pan Am Games in 1967, many Manitobans took an interest in ways to play and compete on our lakes and waterways. Enrolment in the school swelled, as sailing was now a known quantity in the panoply of VB activities. What had always looked fun from the beach, could now be easily taught from the VBYC shore.

The "Boom Era"

Through the seventies and into the eighties, the story of the VBYC was one of competition an growth, as the explosion of club and regatta sailing, combined with the popularity of the Laser dinghy drove an increase in membership. Many sailors, fond of booms, were pleased to welcome a tide of "baby boomers" as the VBYC membership roll lengthened by the season.

In 1985, a new clubhouse was erected - and the space was needed, as the international sensation of Hobie Cat sailing ushered in the time of the catamaran, and many Hobie Cats dotted the shore in front of the mighty new facility.

Through this time, the tireless efforts of the late great Harry Wall allowed The Manitoba Sailing Association's Mobile Sailing School to transition into the VBYC School that continues to empower the nautically curious and sharpen cadets to this day. The visibility of the VBYC on the provincial scene was on the rise, as the sails would fly and trophies would accumulate.

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The 1990's ushered in a colourful time, as sails of pink neon and electric teal began popping up in the distance. Windsurfing had arrived, bringing an action sports swagger, and carefree surfing mentality to the club culture.

Dancing On The Wind - 2000's to Present

With vagabond windsurfers accepted as our own - as the ever-progressive VBYC was on the vanguard of clubs willing to be an all-inclusive water sport facility, accepting all forms of sailing and paddling. After all, the wind isn't concerned with what kind of craft you captain - it's gonna gust regardless, and the VBYC has made it their mission to prepare you to harness it.

Through the millennium, the ever-agile VBYC continued to evolve, as the global action sports revolution caused more and more thrill seeking youths to rig up sails and deepen their skills through expert instruction. The club welcomed the exciting introduction of Kite Sailing, and subsequently the shores of Victoria Beach have become a regional sensation, as the Kite craze continues to uplift the boards and hearts of many water-oriented extremists. This proud tradition of open-mindedness still extends into all levels of the sailing school.

These years saw a fresh generation of volunteers, coaches and race officials take the helm. A young upstart commodore Ryan Van Berkel navigated choppy social and political waters to reestablish the "VB Dance" fundraiser to ensure the long-term viability of the sailing school and club racing programs. The limited edition collection of summer garments emblazoned with the VBYC logo was seen on the backs of influencers and tastemakers from Morris to Milan.

Removal of hazard trees near power lines improves safety and reliability

Manitoba Hydro removed hazardous trees, branches and bush along its power line right-of-ways in the vehicle restricted area at Victoria Beach over several weeks last November and in April.

The work focused on providing adequate clearance to power lines to reduce outages caused by trees and to reduce the fire risk of a downed live line. Tree contact is one of the leading causes of outages.

Work took place in an area north from Arthur Road between First and Eighth Avenues. In lanes between avenues, crews cleared trees and bush under lines with a mechanical mulcher on tracks. Dead trees standing near lines were also removed. Trees were trimmed to provide enough clearance from lines and account for tree growth.

Manitoba Hydro worked in partnership with the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach on the project.

The work followed a major outage last August after high winds caused a large tree to fall on a power line on Eighth Avenue. The downed line caused a fire quickly brought under control by the R M of Victoria Beach Fire Department.

"The incident was a stark reminder of the fire risk of a downed live line in our community," R M of Victo-ria Beach Fire Chief Patzer said. "With conditions so dry, the risk of a fire is extremely high. Anything we can do to prevent a wildfire will help protect cottages and the community we all love."

A fire at Traverse Bay in June 2019, which destroyed several cottages, and a fire behind the Social Scene on Ateah Road in





2004, were both traced to dry conditions.

The tree trimming work will also reduce the number of outages to the Eighth Avenue water treatment plant and the need for a boil water advisory following an outage. Trimming also provides easier access for Manitoba Hydro crews to do maintenance work and respond to emergencies.

Cottager owners are responsible for trees and branches on their property that are growing too close or touching the service line from the hydro pole to their cottage, and to contact a qualified arborist to safe-ly trim branches or remove hazardous trees.



Dr. David Schindler, freshwater scientist

In March of this year, Lake Winnipeg lost a great champion when Dr. David Schindler died at the age of 80 years. An Americanborn scientist, he chose to spend his career mainly in Canada, upon achieving his doctorate in biology from Oxford University. Dr. Schindler was a limnologist, the study of freshwater ecology on inland waters, but his work ranged broadly into the study of phosphates on water, acid rain, climate change, UV radiation and trans-boundary pollutants. He was a giant in the study and protection of the boreal forest, which includes the area on the east shore of Lake Winnipeg, and that we have learned is both fragile and under siege.

The young graduate was recruited by Fisheries Research Board of Canada, and sub-sequently earned the directorship of developing the Experimental Lakes Area (ELA), where he would become a world leader in freshwater research and knowledge. The famed collection of lakes is located in the boreal forest of northwestern Ontario, and feeds into the watershed that becomes the Winnipeg River before emptying into Lake Winnipeg. From 1968 to 1989, Schindler captained ELA in whole-ecosystem experi-ments in the 46 pristine lakes, the most famous of which saw a rubber curtain to divide Lake 226 in half. Both sides of the lake were 'fed' nitrogen and carbon while only one half of the lake was fed phosphates as well. Within a matter of weeks, a dense algal bloom appeared in the water on the phosphate side. Dr. Schindler hired a plane to record the result in what became one of the most iconic and effective scientific photo-graphs ever released. The image reproduced here appeared in over 400 scientific publications and contributed greatly to the banning of phosphates in detergents, im-proving water quality around the world.



Acid rain from sulphuric emissions from smelters and coalburning plants were next in his crosshairs, shown in ELA to disrupt the food chain and leading to species die-off. Schindler campaigned relentlessly throughout the United States and Canada, describ-ing the science behind rain that fell laced with corrosive chemicals, to assist in the cre-ation of the Air Quality Agreement signed by Prime Minister Brian Mulroney and Amer-ican President Ronald Reagan in1991. After 21 years heading Experimental Lakes, Schindler left to teach at the University of Alberta where his work studied and exposed the ecological damage done to the watershed by outflow from pulp mills, coal mines and tailing ponds on the Athabasca River. When he was awarded the prestigious Stockholm Water Prize in 1992, the Alberta Legislature refused to recognize the hon-our. (Subsequently, David Schindler was honoured with the Alberta Order of Excel-lence in 2008 as a professor and mentor for his ground-breaking research.)

Other awards followed, including the Order of Canada, and recognition by Lake Win-nipeg Foundation. Schindler was not deterred in his mission to sound the alarm about climate change, clearcutting and environmental degradation from industrial develop-ment. He was never content to remain in the classroom and lab, preferring to engage with his students with Indigenous people, trappers and people in rural communities all of whom had deeper experience with the land. He was a thorn in the side of politicians who refused to look at the irrefutable evidence. Freshwater and the boreal forest re-mained his great causes.

From the year 2000 on, it is estimated that Schindler gave more public talks than aca-demic lectures. David Schindler retired in 2013 at the age of 73 to live in the moun-tains of BC. ELA carries on its important work in freshwater under the auspices of IISD-ELA.

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VB Tennis Capital Campaign Progress 2020/21

The Capital Campaign Committee has been hard at work over the winter to secure pledges and donations for the rebuilding of our tennis facility. As we know, the facility was built some 40 years ago and is approaching the end of its useful life.

As of mid-June, the campaign has received cash and pledges just over \$250,000. We will continue to fundraise for this important initiative. Construction estimates suggest that we will require approximately \$550,000 to complete the project.

The committee has submitted a strong application for a provincial capital grant that will potentially match up to \$300,000. We hope to find out the decision on the grant in the next 60 days. The success of the grant is not guaranteed as there is intense competition for these grant monies, as dozens of communities in Manitoba have applied.





The Victoria Beach Club is an affiliate member of the Red Cross and the Lifesaving Society. All instructors hold valid Red Cross and Lifesaving Society certification. The swim program convenors for this year are Greg and Lori Edwards. Avery is our Head Swim Instructor, working with returning instructors: Finlay, Blake, Kieran and Matthew. As usual, all registration will be first-come, first-served. Payment is due upon registration. Preferred payment will be debit. A copy of your VB membership information will be required and we ask for your patience. Registration will be on July 4th 10:00-12:00.

*For your convenience, memberships will be available for purchase inside the clubhouse during swim registration or online prior to registration.

Fees and session dates are as follows:

Red Cross Preschool and Swim Kids, Sea Otter (Preschool I/ II) to Level 10

VB Medical Clinic Returns!

GREAT NEWS. We will have a medical clinic this summer.

Again, Under the leadership of Dr. Carry Martens-Barnes, our clinic will be open in 2021. To start:

Hours of operation - 5pm -7pm daily 9:30am - 11:30am every day except Sunday and Wednesday.

As a result of COVID, there will be some protocol changes this year for safety during this pandemic. Only one (1) person will be allowed in the waiting room. Others, please wait outside. There will be a patient card for you to fill out. Please bring your health card with you. Also, bring some cash in case the doctor prescribes a medicine for you. If we do not have the medicine you require, you will be given a prescription that may be filled in Pine Falls, Selkirk or a pharmacy of your choice.

As we remember all too well, Council closed the clinic in 2013. That decision was reversed when public outcry was heard. The clinic returned in 2014, under the leadership of Kathy Brydon. A Community Medical Committee, run by the community with expenses paid for by our tax dollars, was negotiated. It was with deep sadness we lost Kathy in 2017. Our committee has gone forward with her dedication and perseverance in mind.

The role of the committee ranges from securing and scheduling doctors for the summer, stocking the clinic, cleaning the cottage and ensuring it is well cared for. The committee also does a yard clean up, orders equipment, ensures a telephone and internet connection, brings out additional supplies for the clinic as needed, liaisons between Council and the doctors, and helps to orient and welcome new doctors each year.

Many of you have been called upon to help out with startup of the cottage/clinic and other assorted jobs. We are very grateful for the continued commitment of the community. Unfortunately, due to COVID, we were unable to open last year.

Remember, our clinic is open to the Vehicle Restricted Area and all surrounding areas. This is a question that is often posed. The other question asked is how the doctors are reimbursed for their services. Each doc bills Manitoba Health directly. The average number of patients seen at the clinic per summer is approximately 400.

This year we have many doctors who are new to VB. Please welcome them when you meet them.

Hello everyone and welcome back to another spectacular summer at our favourite place – Victoria Beach!

While vaccinating and maintaining social distancing are having a positive effect in stopping the spread of COVID-19, we must be mindful of following protocols and travel restrictions. Please check the Provincial website for the latest on COVID at www.gov. mb.ca/covid19.

Thanks to everyone who came out and participated in the Recycle My Electronics event at the parking lot on June 19th. Recycling old electronics keeps them out of our landfills and in many cases gives electronics a second life with other communities and organizations that desperately need computing equipment.

Are you planning on doing some landscaping this summer? The RM strongly recommends the planting of deciduous trees over conifers. The quality of our soil is not the best, and deciduous trees seem to do better. Check out our list of recommended trees and shrubs at https://victoriabeach.ca/p/local-notices under 'Recommended FireSmart Trees & Shrubs'.

We hate to have to bring it up again, but PLEASE – only household garbage goes into the green garbage bins. Our Public Works folks spend a lot of time and money having to sort improper garbage when the bins are emptied at the landfill. Non-household garbage must be taken directly to the RM Landfill

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located on Hwy 11. If you can't take it yourself, there are many small companies who specialize in this service.

Also, fold down large cardboard boxes before putting them into the recycling – it costs us money to ship recyclables, and unfolded boxes mean we're shipping air!

Our current supply of bear-resistant bins is exhausted and more have been ordered. Email Councillor Bartmanovich at mbartmanovich@victoriabeach.ca to get on the waiting list. In your email, please include your cottage address, mailing address, phone number and number of bins required.

You don't have to purchase a bear-resistant bin from the RM, but starting in May 2022, only bear-resistant bins can be used for curbside pickup. If you think your bin is already bear-resistant, contact Councillor Bartmanovich for an evaluation.

Beach access repairs and upgrades are underway and some have been completed. This summer we're working on the sand ladder at the sand cliffs, the stairs at Clubhouse Beach #2, Redwing and Bayview #3, as well as the stairs at Sandy Bay).

The ramp to the bakery has been upgraded to Accessibility standards, an electric door installed, and upgrades to the handrails are in progress at several locations including the steps to recycling bin at Public Works.

A reminder that building permits are required for all construction, renovation, and demolition projects within the RM. See the RM website at https://victoriabeach.ca/p/forms-documents- under Building Permit Applications.

Hello everyone, I would like to welcome back everyone to the VB Tennis Club. First off I want to welcome Gord Bell as my Co-Convenor. I will let Gord introduce himself to you later in this piece. It has been a difficult winter and spring for a lot of our community. I know everyone is itching to have summer programs similar to last year unfortunately the start to our tennis season programs this year will be limited or modified. Our tennis team is looking forward to seeing everyone starting June 28th. I would like to welcome Megan Pidskalny as our Head Tennis Attendant. We are asking players to practice social distancing while they play tennis. These practices include:

- Keeping six feet apart from other players
- Arriving to your game as close to the court time as possible
- Avoiding handshakes
- Avoid any social gatherings before or after your game
- Remember to wash your hands before playing
- Do not share racquets with anyone else

Similar to last year when you arrive at the tennis courts, bikes are not allowed in the centre area. Please use the racks closest to 4th avenue (West side of courts) or the racks outside courts 4-6. Use the gates by the kiosk for entering the courts and when leaving your court please use the other exit gates. For our first week we will be limited to basic tennis play. Below is the current restrictions that are in effect until June 26th:

- Maximum 5 people per court
- Doubles play is acceptable







- Lessons are acceptable with 1 participant and 1 instructor only per court
- Players do not need to be from the same household to play together/ share the same court
- At this time, no organized event such as leagues and tournaments

Similar to last year changes to restrictions are happening quickly so please check at the courts or our social media pages for updates. Our hope is by July 2nd we can have 25% gathering but, for this issue of the Herald our first week we will be following the above guidelines.

Basic tennis rules now:

Player Behaviour: avoid swearing. Don't interrupt games on other courts for any reason. Wait until a point is over to walk past a court or retrieve a ball.

Balls on your court: if you are in the process of a rally and a ball rolls into your court and disturbs either you or your opponent, stop playing immediately and call a "let". Replay the point. If you can play on safely, return the ball has soon as the point has been completed. Remember, no one wants to be injured and prevented from playing more tennis.

Good sportsmanship, courtesy and fair play are expected from players at all times

Shoe tags, shirts and non-marking tennis shoes must always be worn Maximum playing time is 30 min. for singles and 45 min. for doubles Non-members must pay a daily court fee of \$5.

Full Tennis rules will be posted at the courts during the season.
